AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE HUMAN RESOURCES COMMISSIONER TO PREPARE SPECIFICATIONS FOR AND TO ADVERTISE FOR PROPOSALS ('RFP') FOR THE EXECUTION OF A COMPREHENSIVE JOB AND SALARY STUDY AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SEEK SUCH PROPOSALS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The Human Resources Commissioner is hereby authorized and directed to prepare specifications, and to advertise for a request for proposals (RFP) for the execution of a comprehensive job and salary study, which would include and analysis of the City of Brook Park's employment practices and conditions.

SECTION 2: The Mayor is hereby authorized to seek proposals for the execution of a comprehensive job and salary study, and shall be advertised within a reasonable period of time after the passage of this Ordinance, or no more than 30 days.

SECTION 3: If no proposals are received within 30 days of advertising the RFP, the Human Resources Commissioner is authorized and instructed to contact and request proposals from at least three (3) companies that offer the requested services.

SECTION 4: The money needed for the aforesaid transaction shall be paid from the general fund 100.

SECTION 5: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that

all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for the further reason to seek proposals for a comprehensive job and salary study; provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, since 1999, the incidents of mass shootings in schools and public places has increased at the same time that the overall crime rate has been falling; and

WHEREAS, during the last several years, the amount of random mass gun violence has accelerated and become synonymous with the senseless loss of life and crippling injuries and;

WHEREAS, the use of semi-automatic and automatic weapons with large ammunition clips allows person intent on harm to cause more carnage that would be possible if such weapons were unavailable; and

WHEREAS, military-style weapons coupled with large ammunition clips are not necessary for sportsmen or home protection and constitute a demonstrated threat to the general public; and

WHEREAS, the Assault Weapons Ban expired in 2004 which prohibited the sale of certain semi-automatic and automatic weapons that reduced levels of street violence in the United States; and

WHEREAS, under the current Federal law, background checks are only required for gun sales at licensed dealers; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 40 percent of gun transfers take place between "private" parties—often at gun shows or through anonymous online transactions and are not subject to a federal background check;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio that:

SECTION 1: The Council of the City of Brook Park hereby urges Congress to re-enact the Assault Weapon Ban and new legislation to stop the sale, transfer and importation, and manufacturing of assault weapons.

SECTION 2: The Council of the City of Brook Park hereby calls on the Ohio Congressional Delegation to support legislation to implement these measures.

SECTION 3: The Council of the City of Brook Park supports the implementation of universal background checks to close loopholes in the sale and/or transfer of guns that could get prevent the weapons from getting into the wrong hands.

SECTION 4: The Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and instructed to forward a certified copy of this Resolution to Ohio Senators Sherrod Brown and Rob Portman and Representative Marcy Kaptur, and to have it posted to the City's website.

SECTION 5: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 6: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for further reason to support a ban on the sale of military-grade assault weapons; provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law

WHEREAS, the Council and the City administration hereby requests the Berea City School District to work with Brook Park to see that if those schools do close, then the new proposed high school be built on the current site of Ford Intermediate School; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio that:

SECTION 1: That Council does hereby request that Ford Intermediate School be the new site for the proposed high school.

SECTION 2: This Council and the Administration urge the residents of Brook Park to show their support of this Resolution and ask them to write the Berea City School District requesting that the new high school be built on the current Ford Middle School site.

SECTION 3: That the Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to forward two certified copies of this Resolution to the Berea City School District.

SECTION 4: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for further reason to urge the Berea City School District build the new high school on the site of Ford Intermediate School; therefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least (5) members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


