WHEREAS, the City in Ordinance No. 9993-2015 passed on January 5, 2016, created the Brook Park Home Maintenance Assistance Grant Program (HMAP) for the purpose of providing home maintenance assistance to Brook Park residents; and

WHEREAS, the City now desires to amend Section 1, Term No. 5 of the Home Maintenance Assistance Program and add two additional terms;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: Section 1 Term No. 5 of Ordinance No. 9993-2015, passed January 5, 2016, and reading as follows:

Term No. 5. Brook Park residents in owner occupied residential housing with documented income above federal income assistance guidelines shall be eligible for loans up to \$5,000 in matching funds for documented repairs and improvements to owner occupied residential structures. Priority shall be given to the lowest income applicant

is hereby amended to read:

Term No. 5. Brook Park residents in owner occupied residential housing with documented income above federal income assistance guidelines shall be eligible for loans up to \$5,000 for documented repairs and improvements to owner occupied residential structures. Priority shall be given to the lowest income applicant

SECTION 2: Former Section 1, Term No. 5 of Ordinance No. 9993-2015, as passed on January 5, 2016, is hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION 3: Section 1, Term No. 8 and 9 shall read as follows:

Term No. 8. The yearly period when residents can enroll in the Home Maintenance Assistance Program (HMAP) runs from January 1 through April 15. Priority shall be given to lowest income applicant(s) from the applications received during the enrollment period and will be awarded until annually appropriated funds are exhausted. Any applications received after April 15 shall be reviewed on a first come, first serve basis if any funds remain from the enrollment period applications.

Term No. 9. Once a loan or grant has been awarded to a household, that household is not eligible for another assistance award for a period of seven years.

SECTION 4: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for the further reason that it is necessary to amend Ordinance No. 9993-2015; therefore provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

WHEREAS, Council deems it necessary for the City to enter into a contract with a specialist in order to provide for the maintenance, modernization, and replacement of all electrical traffic signals over which the City has jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, said services are of such a highly specialized nature, requiring the exercise of peculiar skill and aptitude, that said contract is properly deemed excepted from the bidding requirements ordinarily associated with the letting of public contracts.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Signal Service Company, for the maintenance, modernization, and/or replacement of all electrical traffic signals.

SECTION 2: The money needed for the aforesaid transaction shall be paid from the general fund 100; provided that, in no event shall the total amount to be paid under said contract exceed \$40,000.00.

SECTION 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its

committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for the further reason that Council deems it necessary for the Mayor to enter into said contract with undue delay; therefore provided this ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.





RESOLUTION, IN ORDER TO ALLOW THE CITY ADMINISTRATION, COUNCIL
AND THE BROOK PARK PLANNING COMMISSION TO REVIEW APPLICABLE OHIO
STATUTES, CRIMINAL CODES AND THE BROOK PARK ZONING CODE RELATIVE
TO SUCH USE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Ohio General Assembly adopted on June 8, 2016 and the Governor has signed into law 131 Sub. H.B. 523, which becomes effective September 8, 2016; and

WHEREAS, 131 Sub. H.B. 523, among other things, permits patients in Ohio to use medical marijuana on the recommendation of physicians; creates state regulatory oversight of the cultivation, processing, retail sale, use and physician recommendation of medical marijuana; authorizes the legislative authority of a city to adopt regulations to prohibit or limit the number of retail medical marijuana dispensaries; and prohibits a cultivator, processor, retail dispensary or laboratory from being located or relocating within 500 feet of a school, church, public library, public playground or public park; and

WHEREAS, as such, the City's Administration, Council and the Planning and Zoning Commission require additional time to undertake a review of all applicable codes statewide and within the city in order to formulate a local response to 131 Sub. H.B. 523; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Constitution of the State of Ohio Revised Code, municipalities have the power to enact planning and zoning laws that are for health, safety, welfare, comfort and peace of the citizens of the municipality including redistricting areas used for businesses and trades;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio that:

SECTION 1: That the Council of the City of Brook Park, hereby extends the moratorium on the granting of building permits or certificates of occupancy for any building, structure, use or change of use that would enable the cultivation, processing, or retail sale of medical marijuana for a period not to exceed six months from the effective date of this Resolution, in order to allow the City Administration, Council and the Brook Park Planning and Zoning Commissions to review applicable Ohio statutes, criminal codes and the Brook Park Zoning Code relative to such use.

SECTION 2: The purpose of this Resolution, "medical marijuana" shall have the same meaning as that term is defined in Section 3796.01(A)(2) of the Ohio Revised Code, effective March 16, 2017.

SECTION 3: No building permits, certificates of occupancy or any other permits shall be granted to a business owner who intends to open, use any land or devote any floor area of the business for the purposes of the cultivation, processing, or retail sale of medical marijuana for the period of this moratorium. No valid existing business in the City may expand in any way that would establish cultivation, processing, or retail sale of medical marijuana for the duration of the moratorium.

SECTION 4: The moratorium shall be in effect for a period of six months from the effective date of this Resolution or until changes are enacted to amend the Codified Ordinances of the City of Brook Park to address these issues or until Council approves legislation explicitly revoking this moratorium, whichever occurs first.

SECTION 5: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 6: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for the further reason that the City of Brook Park would like to impose a six month moratorium on building and/or occupancy permits regarding medical marijuana; provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law



NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: Section 121.01(a) and (b) of the Brook Park Codified Ordinances, passed by Ordinance No. 8346-1997, passed May 20, 1997; Ordinance No. 8708-2000, passed February 6, 2001; Ordinance 9000-2003, passed June 17, 2003; Ordinance No. 9581-2009, passed May 19, 2009, and reading as follows:

COUNCIL SALARY

121.01(a) The salary of the President of Council for one year commencing January 1, 2010, until duly changed, is hereby fixed at fifteen thousand seven hundred thirty-five dollars (15,735) per annum, payable in monthly installments. The salary of the President of Council for one year commencing January 1, 2011, until duly changed, is hereby fixed at fifteen thousand seven hundred thirty-five dollars (\$15,735) per annum, payable in monthly installments. The salary of the President of Council for one year commencing January 1, 2012, until duly changed, is hereby fixed at sixteen thousand two hundred seven dollars (\$16,207) per annum payable in monthly installments. The salary of the President of Council for one year commencing January 1, 2013 until duly changed, is hereby fixed at sixteen thousand six hundred ninety-three dollars (\$16,693)per annum, payable in monthly installments.

is hereby amended to read:

121.01(a) The salary of the President of Council commencing January 1, 2018 until duly changed is hereby fixed at \$12,500.00 per annum payable in monthly installments.

121.01 (b) The salary of the members of Council for one year commencing January 1, 2010, until duly changed, is hereby fixed at fourteen thousand four hundred forty-six dollars (\$14,446) per annum, payable in monthly installments. The salary of the members of Council for one year commencing January 1, 2011, until duly changed, is hereby fixed at fourteen thousand four hundred forty-six dollars (\$14,446) per annum, payable in monthly installments. The salary of the members of Council for one year commencing January 1, 2012, until duly changed, is hereby fixed at fourteen thousand eight hundred seventy-nine dollars (\$14,879) per annum, payable in monthly installments. The salary of the members of Council for one year commencing January 1, 2013, until duly changed, is hereby fixed at fifteen thousand three hundred twenty-five dollars (\$15,325) per annum, payable in monthly installments.

is hereby amended to read:

121.01 (b) The salary of the members of Council for one year commencing January 1, 2018, until duly changed, is hereby fixed at twelve thousand five hundred dollars (\$12,500) per annum, payable in monthly installments.

SECTION 2: Former Section 121.01(a) and (b) of the Brook Park Codified Ordinances, as passed by passed by Ordinance No. 8346-1997, passed May 20, 1997; Ordinance No. 8708-2000, passed February 6, 2001; Ordinance 9000-2003, passed June 17, 2003; Ordinance No. 9581-2009, passed May 19, 2009, is hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for the further reason to amend Section 121.01(a) and (b) of the Brook Park Codified Ordinances; therefore this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.


