AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO PREPARE SPECIFICATIONS AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE LOWEST AND/OR BEST BIDDER TO RESTORE THE ROOF AND WALLS IN THE NATATORIUM, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Recreation Center's pool area has significantly deteriorated, due to age and years of disuse; and

WHEREAS, when the City of Brook Park built the Natatorium, a vapor barrier or insulation was not placed between the brick façade and the masonry block on the exterior walls; and

WHEREAS, because of the lack of a vapor retarder or insulation on the exterior walls, serious water vapor has condensed on the outside wall causing damage to the walls; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to replace the roof and install insulation to act as a vapor barrier, to assure continuous vapor control, and to restore the walls for the building to be used for the pool.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio, that:

- The Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to prepare specifications for the restoration of the pool building, including the roof and wall replacement to assure continuous vapor control.
- SECTION 2: The Mayor is hereby authorized to advertise for bids and to enter into a contract with the lowest and/or best bidder for the purchase of same.

SECTION 3: The money needed for the aforesaid transaction

shall be paid from funds theretofore appropriated for said purpose.

TO PROVIDE FOR NEW REQUIREMENTS AND INCREASED PENALITIES FOR BLOCKED RAILROAD CROSSINGS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, House Bill 361 proposes to amend Sections 121.95 and 5589.99 and to enact new section 5589.25 of the Revised Code to establish new requirements and increased penalties that apply to a railroad company that unlawfully blocks a railroad crossing; and

WHEREAS, House Bill 361 would require a railroad company to submit to the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio an incident report each time a train blocks a crossing for more than five (5) minutes to the hindrance of traffic, and

WHEREAS, House Bill 361 proposes a Five Thousand Dollar (\$5000.00) fine for a first violation and Ten Thousand Dollar (\$10,000.00) fine for subsequent violations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio that:

- SECTION 1: That the Council of the City of Brook Park, hereby expresses its support of House Bill 361 to amend Ohio law imposing new requirements and increased penalties.
- SECTION 2: The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this Resolution to the introducer of the bill, Representatives Thomas Hall and Jessica E. Miranda.

AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN
AGREEMENT WITH PROTEGIS FIRE & SAFETY TO REPAIR THE FIRE
SPRINKLER LINE IN VAULT OUTSIDE SERVICE DEPARTMENT, AND DECLARING
AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Council deems it necessary for the City to enter into an agreement with Protegis Fire & Safety to repair the Fire Sprinkler Line in vault outside Service Department; and

WHEREAS, after formal inspection, it was discovered that the FDC was filled with water which indicates the check valve is leaking and needs to be replaced; and

WHEREAS, said repairs need to be made to install a new FDC connection, check valve and piping; and

WHEREAS, the repair to the Fire Sprinkler Line will be \$8,112.00.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an agreement with Protegis Fire & Safety for the Fire Sprinkler Line repairs, as set forth in Exhibit "A" (quote).

SECTION 2: The money needed for the aforesaid transaction shall be paid from funds theretofore appropriated for said purposes; from Fund No. 401-422-52401, Capital Fund, provided that, in no event shall the total amount to be paid under said agreement exceed \$8,112.00.

SECTION 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for the further reason to authorize the Mayor to enter into an agreement for the repair of the Fire Sprinkler Line in vault outside of the Service Department; therefore, provided this ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members elected to Council. It shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
