AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CONSULTING ENGINEER TO PREPARE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS, AND THE MAYOR TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT(S) WITH THE LOWEST AND/OR BEST BIDDER FOR THE DEMOLITION OF THE FORMER BROOK PARK MEMORIAL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Council authorized the Mayor to enter into a contract to purchase the former Brook Park Memorial Elementary School, located at 16900 Holland Road, Brook Park, Ohio (PPN 343-17-088) by Ordinance number 11075-2019, passed March 26, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the building is in a state of disrepair and it has been deemed to be in the best interest of the City to demolish the existing structure(s).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio, that:

- SECTION 1: The Consulting Engineer is hereby authorized to prepare plans and specifications, and the Mayor is authorized to advertise for bids and enter into a contract with the lowest and/or best bidder for said Demolition Project.
- SECTION 2: The Mayor on behalf of the City of Brook Park is hereby authorized to contract with the Consulting City Engineer (Euthenics, Inc.) for Engineering, Bidding, and Construction Administration services for said Demolition Project in accordance with Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
- $\underline{\mathtt{SECTION}\ 3}\colon$ The money needed for the aforesaid transaction shall be paid from the Economic Development Fund No. 243, theretofore appropriated or to be appropriated for said purpose.
- SECTION 4: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public

in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for the further reason Council deems it necessary to proceed with the Demolition Project as soon as possible; therefore provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


