

**REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BROOK PARK, OHIO
TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 4, 2014**

The meeting was called to order by Council President Patten at 8:00 p.m. The clerk called the roll and the following Members of Council answered:

D'AMICO, TROYER, SALVATORE, MENCINI, BURGIO, POWERS, HIGGINS

Also in attendance were Mayor Coyne, Finance Director Cingle, Service Director Cayet, Safety Director Byrnes, Recreation Director Fields, Engineer Piatak, Law Director Jamison, Gary Marken.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF PRECEDING MEETINGS:

1. Regular Council Meeting held on January 28, 2014.

Motion by Mr. Higgins, supported by Mr. Mencini, to approve as printed. Members of Council voted AYE. The motion carried.

REMARKS FROM THE AUDIENCE (ON ANY SUBJECT):

REPORTS FROM STANDING COMMITTEES:

Aviation & Environmental Committee – Chairman, Higgins

Mr. Higgins stated the hub at the airport is being shut down.

Finance Committee – Chairman, D'Amico

Mr. D'Amico stated the Board of Control met earlier this evening and approved eleven items. The auditors have started the audit for the city that will take a few days. The items in the Finance Committee currently are for Purchasing Commissioner, 2 ½% income tax and the 4.50 mill additional tax and in speaking with Council Members there are many different ideas and not having an understanding where the city is without the budget being present, those items will remain in committee at this point.

Legislative Committee – Chairman, Troyer

Mr. Troyer stated the Legislative Committee has one item in committee and two items on tonight's agenda.

Parks & Recreation Committee – Chairman, Burgio

Mr. Burgio deferred his report to the new Director of Recreation, Mary Ann Fields, and welcomed her aboard.

Planning Committee – Chairman, Mencini

Mr. Mencini stated at yesterday's meeting Select Used Cars requested a permit to operate a used car lot on Brookpark Road and West 150th Street. The commission denied this request due to lack of parking spaces and the city prefers new car dealerships. The commission is currently reviewing the request from Southwest Cab

for a 120' communication tower/two-way radio system and mounted antenna structure.

Safety Committee – Chairman, Salvatore

Mr. Salvatore stated the Safety Committee has legislation on tonight's agenda.

Service Committee – Chairwoman, Powers

Mrs. Powers stated no report this evening.

Board of Zoning Appeals – Chairman, D'Amico

Mr. D'Amico stated the February 3rd meeting was cancelled due to no applications received by the deadline. The next meeting is scheduled for March 3rd at 7:00 p.m.

REPORTS FROM SPECIAL COMMITTEES:**Southwest General Health Center – Trustee, Salvatore**

Mr. Salvatore reported the first meeting will be held February 26th.

Berea Board of Education – Representative, Mencini

Mr. Mencini reported there were five snow days in January and at yesterday's meeting the board approved a Resolution adopting the Calamity Days alternative makeup plans or Blizzard Backs. This allows for teachers to present online lessons equal or greater to three scheduled days of school. Teachers will prepare these lessons prior to November 1st and this would be in lieu of additional days at the end of the school year, with approval by the state board. The Community for Good Schools is an organization that represents the school board for tax levies that will be having a fundraiser on February 28th from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the Berea American Legion, tickets are \$25.00. Brook Park Memorial is rebuilding the playground on the east side of the school near I-71 to make the school handicapped accessible. This project will cost \$175,000 and the school is looking for city businesses to purchase a brick in the amount of \$100.00. Corporate sponsors are also being sought that will receive a sign to posted on Holland Road. The school will also be having a fundraiser on March 8th from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

REPORTS FROM BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS:**INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS OF COMMENDATION:****REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR:**

I think it's in order for me to give a small, short State of the City address and I heard the Finance Committee Chairman indicate why he's holding pieces of legislation in committee. I came to this office believing that the people of this community wanted the situation in this town to improve and I painstakingly spent the last month with the Finance Director trying to fashion a budget that would allow us to provide services to residents within the constraints of what the city's revenue is. I believe that I made it very clear to each and every Member of City Council that the city's revenue in

the income tax area is going to be about \$1.4 million dollars short of what it was last year. I believe I indicated to each and every Member of Council that the city was going to spending into the reserves again, and that's been going on for over seven years and clearly cannot continue. I have been working with the unions and in five positions I probably reduced the cost of this city about \$60,000, individual people's lives and families are being affected. I had a proposal that the Finance Chairman left out was for the former Recreation Director. Councilman Higgins was very clear at a prior meeting by saying that it's not the individual it's the position. Some of the legislation given to Council I spoke about was the income tax and property tax that the Finance Director spoke about. Those are important to have discussions about because if there are ideas they need to be exchanged on this Council floor, not in telephone conversations with Members of Council. It's never been my intention coming into this term to get in the inner-politics of the legislative branch of government. I hope everyone takes this with what is meant and that is to move the city forward. Mr. Chairman, I had a discussion with you yesterday that this evening I wanted to have a resident of the city, who happens to be a Purchasing Commissioner, make a presentation to the Council to explain why I'm asking for that position to be considered, not legislation just a discussion. In my twenty years in the city and as member of Council discussion was always put on the Council agenda. I think it's unfair to the Administration; I think it's unfair to this Council the structures of these meetings, they're not workable to discuss things in one-half hour. It can't be done particularly when there are new members that needs to be remedied. This city cannot have an individual chairman holding up legislation that should be discussed and debated this is the place. Let me tell you a deadline, you looked at all these crucial deadlines tonight, here is the deadline February 5th. That's when legislation has to go down to the Board of Elections to be put on the May ballot, we missed that opportunity. While we may not have agreed on that it should have been debated that and I think it was probably the most important issue that's going to come before this Council this year. Because the only other alternative is in August which will cost the city \$30,000 or in November, why is that important? You can talk about the budget all you want but if there is no certainty that revenue is becoming beyond this and there is an opportunity to put that before the people for discussion then the decisions that Greg Cingle and I have to make are very vastly impacted. Because reserves cannot be spent anymore it will change this budget drastically and that's what we should be discussing before this Council is the budget. I met with each one of you individually and I will continue to do that if we're going to be partners in moving this city forward. I don't want to get into debates about what's an emergency everything you have on here this evening is an emergency, that's not an argument. There are other issues that we need to get at so I would ask Council to look at their rules; facilitate more meetings for the purpose discussions of issues only and not be compelled to either put it on the agenda that evening or not put it on the agenda that evening and the city gets behind. Some of these deadlines are not set by the Administration, we have no authority over them, we have to relate to them, and that's the most important emergency of this issue before us. If the Finance Chairman needs to talk about issues he should be talking to me about them, I've afforded him the time and spent time with him probably more time than anybody else. He didn't call me up to discuss one of these particular issues with me and how important and how imperative they were to move the city forward. That's where we're at today and we cannot conduct serious business this way. That's not a criticism of Council but I need you to look at and view how we're going to operate particularly in the first quarter of the year when all of these decisions have to be made. It is my responsibility to make you aware of this and that's what I'm doing this evening.

Mr. Higgins asked Mayor Coyne when the budget will be available for discussion on the floor of the meeting. Have you had discussions with the Finance Director when that process can begin?

Mayor Coyne responded the budget is about ready to go but I will tell you one thing, Councilman that will not change the need for new revenue. The budget will show spending into the reserves and for Council to do any kind of meaningful roads program this year the city will have to borrow those monies, this is not something political it's real and we need to take it seriously.

Mr. D'Amico stated to Mayor Coyne and Law Director Jamison that as far as any deadlines go for the Board of Elections, I understand what you had written down and understand where you got them from, but I also understand to Mr. Jamison that the income tax ordinance amending a section of the city's tax code has to be done like brought forward. I also understand that there has to be a Resolution which is a second piece that can run simultaneously, but hasn't been brought forward to make the Election Board put this on the ballot. I didn't think you would have time for it and Neal, you being the law director and putting this together and Mayor, you bringing this forward, that if both pieces weren't put together there wouldn't have been enough time to put this on the ballot for February 5th.

Mr. Jamison stated to Mr. D'Amico I find it interesting that you never called me to raise that question and it's my understanding that you're calling on your own to the Board of Elections to ask them for opinions on how this should be done. When you never even put a call into me to question if it needed to be done. I would point out that in Section 5 of the proposed ordinance there is language in that ordinance that calls for a certified copy of the ordinance to be sent to the Board of Elections to put the issue on the ballot and we followed the template that was used last time when this issue was placed on the ballot. If you have an issue or a question as to how it's being placed I find it interesting that you never called me; you never sent me a memo and you never asked about it. So this is now an issue and I would appreciate you talking to me so that we can then work this out with the Board of Elections. This is the first I'm hearing of it and so I would dispute what you're contending but if I'm wrong we will do it.

Mayor Coyne stated having served on the Board of Elections for six years and as Chairman the board always refer back to the city's law director for language. There's no mistake about this deadline and what Neal said is we're all in this together, either we're partners or we're not. This isn't about me individually or you individually or politically this is the financial strength of this city and as the Finance Chairman you should be talking to me everyday, if you're interested. I'm willing to work with any Member of this Council to move these things forward, this isn't any political agenda and I'm telling you right now that we have to do something. So this limits our opportunity to get this on the May ballot but if you would have called if that was your only issues it would be pretty easy to remedy. This is not easy, it's painstaking, and

everything that is being recommended to this Council is how do we operate this city within the budget that we're working on right now. Everything I've proposed to you is very important so Councilman let's be frank if you're serious in being partners to move this city forward and have dialogue with people, no one is out to hurt you and you're not having dialogue with anybody you're just doing this yourself.

Mr. Mencini stated being one of the new Council persons I can't speak for the other new members but all of us have a history in Brook Park and as we all know there was a big lack of communication starting at the top with the last administration. I agree with the Mayor that can't be anymore. I think correspondence has been good with all of us but with certain issues we have to get it down because there are a lot of big decisions coming this year and it has to be us to hit a high batting average. Hopefully from tonight on this Council will go into the direction of agreeing with the Mayor for some unity.

Mr. Higgins commented that I'm going to agree with Councilman Mencini but if we're going to have some unity here then we have to have frank conversations on the floor of the Council meeting, not just in the parking lots or over the telephone. Let's get it out in the open and be honest with each other on the floor of this meeting too.

Mayor Coyne apologized for creating controversy this evening.

Mr. Patten stated the one thing addressed Mayor was the Purchasing Commissioner that was legislation introduced and put in committee. However, as I told you yesterday I would have gladly put that person on the agenda for your presentation but the first time you talked to me about it was yesterday. So in the future, like we said yesterday, let's work together; communicate; you talk to me and I'll talk to you and let's get this moving. I don't have any issue with that but I do want that clear as if it was being side-stepped, that's not the truth.

Mayor Coyne responded you brought up about the Purchasing Commissioner I didn't. What I'm saying is that always when someone was making a presentation what I sent to you and I sent to the Council was a presentation by a resident of this city. To make a presentation to explain why a purchasing commissioner and how it operates, it had nothing to do with the legislation.

Mr. Patten stated that presentation will be placed on the February 25th Caucus agenda and in speaking with Members of Council there will be added meetings for the budget as well as the other issues as far as taxes. So the residents of this city will have plenty of public forums to be able to come and be heard and the Mayor will be able to explain their sides and Council will be educated on it.

**REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM OTHER DEPARTMENTS,
COMMISSIONS, PUBLIC OFFICIALS:**

Service Director Cayet

Mr. Cayet stated that if there is any lawn damage from plow trucks contact the service department at 433-7192 between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. to be put on the list for repairs in the spring, residents can also call the department to report potholes.

Mr. Higgins stated that the sidewalk plow came through my neighborhood for the first time this year and numerous communities used these plows and moth-balled them because of the amount of damage caused. I was just curious if a possible policy could be enacted where if the plow comes through a neighborhood and there are numerous sidewalks that have already been cleared maybe the blade could be lifted when tracking through. For example I did my sidewalk and a few of my neighbors' sidewalks and the plow came through even though all three of those properties were already cleaned which doesn't make any sense.

Engineer Piatak

Mr. Piatak stated legislation will be coming forward for the construction and administration services for the Engle Road Resurfacing Project. Mr. Piatak thanked Council for their consideration of the Ruple Road landslide legislation.

Mr. Burgio stated to Engineer Piatak on Engle Road when the new sewers were installed were there any problems with residents having the sewers and storm drains going into one duct.

Mr. Piatak responded the vitals that came across were separated but there were some storm connections that came into the sanitary sewer that has been corrected.

Mr. Higgins thanked Engineer Piatak for the quick and hard work in securing the monies for the Ruple Road project.

Safety Director Byrnes

Mr. Byrnes stated no report this evening.

Law Director Jamison

Mr. Jamison stated no report this evening.

Recreation Director Fields

Ms. Fields stated that she has met with the staff to go over the new restructuring and reorganization as well as the standards of operation and her expectations. Things are moving well and registrations began last Saturday and the numbers were fairly low so marketing efforts have to be upped to recruit more participants. The Recreation Center will be hosting the Red Cross Blood Drive on Friday, February 21st from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Mr. Higgins stated to new Recreation Center Director Fields that he had a conversation with a long-time user of the center today and the resident wanted me to send along his compliments when he walked into the center today he was greeted with a hello and had to look over his shoulder to make sure the staff was talking to him.

Mr. Mencini congratulated Recreation Director Fields for a very good job this past Saturday with picture day and so forth.

Finance Director Cingle

Mr. Cingle stated January monthly reports will be distributed the next few days.

Mr. Higgins stated to Finance Director Cingle that the Mayor informed Council that the city will experience a \$1.4 million dollar income tax shortfall this year, compared to last year. Could you give the highlight of a business or two that represents the decrease in income tax?

Mr. Cingle stated not to speak for the Mayor but I believe what he was referring to was the potential structural deficit of approximately \$1.4 million dollars and not the income tax collections being reduced. In fact the department reviewed the income tax projections and those projections are showing a \$70,000 or \$80,000 increase in income tax collections for this year.

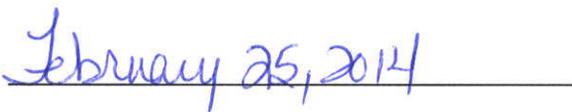
