meeting minutes for April 19, 2016, have been adopted. We will move to letter D, which is reports of Standing Committees, go to Aviation and Environmental.

MR. TROYER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. The Legislative Committee has one item on tonight's agenda, and also the Legislative Committee has a few items in committee and as a reminder if anybody have anything in the Legislative Committee, give me a call if you want it brought up and I will bring it out. Thank you.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Thank you. We'll go to Parks and Recreation. Councilman Mencini?

MR. MENCINI: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

1 recreation center. We're probably halfway through the
 2 month so get up there and get your membership, get a
 3 workout, get signed up now, get signed up tomorrow, get
 4 signed up the rest of the week, just

 6 Don't miss that wonderful opportunity.

7 This Sunday October 23rd will be the annual
 8 youth Halloween party from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. The theme
 9 will be Disney. Please bring a nonperishable food item
 10 to be donated. We will have carnival games, prizes,
 11 candy, bounce houses, hay rides and much, much, much
 12 more. A special thank you to the Brook Park Boosters,
 13 Mayor Coyne, and Walmart for all the donations for this
 14 event. Monday October 24, 2016, at 7 p.m. the Mayor's
 15 renovation plan for the Recreation Center, City Hall and
 16 Council Chamber presentation will be in the main
 17 gymnasium. Again, that will be Monday the 24th. I'm
 18 sure the Mayor will probably cover that a little more, and
 19 be discussed once or twice tonight

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Thank you. We'll move
 9 to the Safety committee. Councilman Salvatore?

 11 Safety committee has one item for the purchase of
 12 Police Cameras and Videos with Sound Recorders. This
 13 is the only item I have on the agenda tonight and hoping
 14 that it passes under Suspension of the Rules this
 15 evening. Thank you.

16 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Thank you. We'll move
 17 to the Service committee. Councilman Burgio?

18 MR. BURGIO: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. The
 19 Service committee has several items on tonight's
 20 agenda.

21 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Thank you. We'll move

1 to Board of Zoning Appeals. Councilman Scott?

2 MR. SCOTT: Thank you, sir. There is
 3 nothing on the Board of Zoning Appeals for
 4 tonight.

5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. That concludes
 6 items under letter D. We'll move to letter E, which is
 7 reports of Special Committees from Southwest General
 8 Health Center. Trustee Salvatore?

9 MR. SALVATORE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
 10 The board met on October 12th, and at that meeting we
 11 approved a revised financial assistance and emergency
 12 medical policy in order to be in compliance with the new
 13 IRS regulations. Later in the meeting we had a full and
 14 detailed report given by the Vice-President and Chief
 15 Accounting Officer. The topics that were discussed
 16 were the Community Health Assessment for 2016, that
 17 report was 91 pages long, then the Implementation
 18 Strategy and then finally an Executive Summary.

19 Under my committee we filled a vacancy in
 20 Strongsville, with a gentleman by the name of Terry
 21 Toth. I do believe he will do a fine job for the
 22 hospital in his new position as trustee. In the
 23 community involvement, the initiatives currently are
 24 underway related to drug addiction programs. Southwest
 25 General will be working with our police and fire

1 departments to support this effort. And finally, I also
2 attended an all-day workshop session which is known as
3 Trustee Advance which covered most of what we've
4 been working on during the Strategic Planning
5 Committee meetings. We finally completed all the
6 meetings and our consultants are preparing for the
7 presentation to make to the board sometime within the
8 next couple of week. Finally, again, Mr. Chairman, my
9 next meeting is scheduled for the last Wednesday of
10 October, and I will have another report following that.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Thank you. We'll
12 move to the Berea Board of Education. Councilman
13 Burgio?

14 MR. BURGIO: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I
15 have a couple items to report. The board acknowledged
16 and honored **Meet the Titans** third grade student
17 Kaylee Carter at the October 10th regular meeting. A
18 presentation was made also on behalf of the Education
19 Foundation with an update in history of its inception by
20 the school district's resident, Executive Director in
21 celebrating 20 years. The purchase of a 72-passenger
22 school bus was approved at a cost of 72,300. A
23 technology purchase was also approved for Datamation
24 Systems carts for our for 32 tablets at a quantity of 11 at
25 a cost of \$13,200. .Google Chrome console of 319 to

1 to set those items for a cost 8,147.26, and 319 Dell chrome book at
2 a cost of 75,866.77, totaling \$97,215. The board approved
3 payment of longevity to certified class by personnel. The board
4 also approved the Treasurer recommendation of financial
5 statements and payment to vendors, certificate of availability
6 investments and two gifts of donations to the annual Berea Midpark
7 Turkey Trot, which is coming up in support of area food banks.
8 Two donations, one was \$50 from Laurie and David **Bartolotto**,
9 and \$75 from Richard Salvatore, I think I know that guy. The
10 board also approved Memorandum of Understanding of Lou Groza
11 between the Berea School District, Cleveland Browns Lou Groza
12 Youth Football and USA Football, Recreation departments and
13 outside groups. Which is a policy of 7510. In that policy
14 agreement included is that the parties will meet annually to work
15 cooperatively to address any scheduling adjustments prior to
16 June 1st of each year. And lastly, the final bond issue information
17 night has been rescheduled for Monday, October 24th instead of
18 Tuesday October 25th due to district activities. However, that is

14 MAYOR COYNE: Thank you very much, Mr.
15 Chairman. I just want to reiterate what Councilman
16 Mencini reported that Monday October 24th at 7:00 we'll
17 be having a public presentation on a method by which we
18 can make improvements at the recreation center. We are
19 finalizing the drafts and doing further analysis on the
20 dollar amounts and as soon as that is completed, when
21 the public presentation is done we will have a formal
22 presentation of all the information some Councilmembers
23 are requesting.

24 Some of the kids brought home from school
25 today, it is my understanding is that the Board of Education is

1 going to have a meeting that evening on their
2 improvements as well. So maybe the mother could go to
3 school and the father could come to the rec, or vise-
4 versa. They're both equally important decisions that at
5 least in one case the voters have to make and the
6 other case of our rec center that we as the Mayor and

8 to our young people. Our Recreation center is
9 important to the whole community because it's going

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Thank you.
3 Seeing no other questions to the Mayor we'll move the
4 agenda to letter I, which is Reports and
5 Communications from Departments, Commissions, and
6 other Public Officials. We'll go to the City Engineer,
7 Mr. Piatak.
8 MR. PIATAK: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. A
9 couple of projects to report on this evening. The 2016
10 Sidewalk Repair Program, that's going to get fired up
11 here in the next couple of weeks. We are still
12 accepting money for that phase so if anybody still wants
13 to be a part of that, get their money into the Service
14 department. The 2016 Crack and Joint Sealing Program
15 contracts are executed. I have a pre-construction
16 meeting set up for next week, and expect to get started
17 on that project the following week. So there will be
18 some crack sealing crews throughout the neighborhoods
19 and around town. The Smith Road Project Phase Four,
20 all the mainline sewer installation and manholes are
21 complete. Contractors currently working on service
22 connections, so you know, as you travel through that
23 area please be aware of the construction equipment and
24 traffic patterns that change throughout the day. So
25 just be aware of that.

1 Michael Drive Reconstruction Phase Five,
2 that's the section between Hummel Road and Snow Road.
3 We have a second mainline pour scheduled for tomorrow.
4 Follow up with aprons and some under drain work later
5 this week and early in the next week and that project
6 will really wind down here in the next week, week and a
7 half. The Fry Road Reconstruction Phase One Project.
8 Phase one of that project, that's Holland and Sylvia.
9 We got just about all the underground work wrapped up.
10 If we don't we'll have it all wrapped up by the end of
11 the week. And we anticipate starting the pavement
12 removal phase of that project early next week. That's
13 all I have this evening.
14 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Thank you.
15 Council, any questions to the Engineer. Councilman
16 Troyer?
17 MR. TROYER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
18 Through the chair, to the Engineer, Mr. Piatak. I just
19 went by that corner lot on Leslie and **Plant Lane**
20 and there some areas around the corner there up
21 closer to -- well, both ends go to Sylvia, so north of
22 there. Around that corner there's quite a few bare
23 spots. Any chance you can get out
24 there this year? It's getting late in the season.
25

1 MR. PIATAK: Actually, through the chair,
 2 it's probably a good time with the seasonably warm
 3 temperatures that we had. I know I was growing some
 4 grass at my house, and I was having a hard time getting
 5 it to come up. I think we're getting into good time
 6 right now; it might be a short window. But I'm trying
 7 to get a meeting set up with the contractor that did
 8 that project for Thursday, and walk that project to show
 9 him exactly what I'm looking for. So, we're still
 10 working -- I'm still working on getting him over there
 11 to get that squared away.

12 MR. TROYER: So possibly on Thursday any
 13 chance you can give me a call? Maybe I can meet you out
 14 there when you do that?

15 MR. PIATAK: Sure.

16 MR. TROYER: All right. I appreciate it.
 17 And then you mentioned crack sealing. What streets? Do
 18 we have a list of street that we're going to be crack
 19 sealing at?

20 MR. PIATAK: I do. But I don't -- off the
 21 top of my head I couldn't tell you.

22 MR. TROYER: Okay.

23 MR. PIATAK: I could provide the list for
 24 you.

25 MR. TROYER: Can you e-mail that to me?

1 MR. PIATAK: Sure.

2 MR. TROYER: I'd appreciate it. And did you
 3 give any consideration to having the legislation pass
 4 this year for the inspector for the 2017 Sidewalk
 5 Program so we have a count on how many blocks need to be
 6 done so we can address that in the next budget?

7 MR. PIATAK: Yes, that legislation will be
 8 coming forward here shortly.

9 MR. TROYER: Excellent. Thank you. That's
 10 it.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Councilman Mencini?

12 MR. MENCINI: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Hey,
 13 Ed, just so you know, I -- was we'll cover it again
 14 later on, I was in my ward, a lot of phone calls this
 15 week trying to stay in contact with a lot of people,
 16 e-mails. That Smith Road Project going pretty good. I
 17 mean, I talked to quite a few people on Smith Road, at
 18 least I'm not aware, I didn't hear too many problems,
 19 so that's going pretty good. Probably will go over this
 20 with the safety director, amongst a few other things,
 21 on that Fry Road, how is the traffic flow going? I
 22 know it's really, really slowed down especially during
 23 the day when they're doing the work between Sylvia
 24 and Holland. My question is, I guess, a little bit and,
 25 again, I'll look

1 to the safety director. But at night kind of sometimes going
 2 the wrong way, a little bit of speeding and they
 3 tend to cut throughout, but I'll take that up with the
 4 safety director. How is that going on Fry Road with the
 5 traffic flow?

6 MR. PIATAK: I guess, you know, when I'm
 7 there, you know, during the day, I don't see a whole lot
 8 of lot of traffic coming through that area. I think
 9 everybody's found their own way. And I think the
 10 residents that live in that area, you know, recognize
 11 that, you know, if there is a way to get around they're
 12 going to, and I haven't heard any complaints or any
 13 issues so...

14 MR. MENCINI: Now same here. I mean, I'll
 15 say that. I talked to a few people on Fry Road, too. A
 16 little more than I'm making out, but overall they're
 17 pretty satisfied. They say the guys are really good
 18 about letting them in and out, letting them through, at
 19 the most time, inconvenience that they can. But okay.
 20 I appreciate it, and I will take the rest up with the
 21 safety director. Thank you. That's all I have, Mr.
 22 Chairman.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: All right. Before we
 24 move off Mr. Piatak, that e-mail that you're going to
 25 send out about the crack sealing, can you just e-mail

1 that to the clerk so that she can forward it to all
 2 Members of Council then?

3 MR. PIATAK: Certainly.

4 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Thank you. Okay. We'll
 5 move to the service director, Mr. Cayet.

6 MR. CAYET: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I'll
 7 report on the -- two Saturdays ago we had the Shred it
 8 Days. We picked up 3.8 ton of paper came through the
 9 shredding machine. That's about 1.6 ton more than we
 10 had in the October of 2015. In June we had 3.4 ton went
 11 through the shredder machine. So next year the
 12 shredding dates will be April 15th and October 7th.
 13 That would be in our letter that we send out to the
 14 residents in January with the schedules and the calendar
 15 on dates of bulk pickup and also the recycling weeks.

16 The ground crews for the ball fields, the
 17 football fields and such have done a fantastic job. I
 18 don't know if any of you had the opportunity to take a
 19 look at what they've been doing to the football field.
 20 But they've been doing a wonderful job up there. It
 21 takes two guys a whole day to paint it up and a lot of
 22 people give them compliments, calling me and e-mailing
 23 me how nice they feel the fields are looking. Other
 24 than that, besides the day-to-day operations of the
 25 department there is nothing else to report on.

1 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Thank you.
2 Council, any questions to the service director?
3 Councilman Mencini?

4 MR. MENCINI: Thank you again, Mr. Chairman.
5 Lou, when will that drop off end down at the service
6 garage? Do you have a date for that?

7 MR. CAYET: No. It will be like last year,
8 Councilman, I'm going to play it by ear.

9 MR. MENCINI: Okay. And, yeah, I would say
10 on that athletic field they did a beautiful job on that
11 football field, also when they did paint for the breast
12 cancer awareness it was beautiful. A lot of compliments
13 up there. So as always, guys, doing a good job. That's
14 all I have, Mr. Chairman. Thank you.

15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Thank you.
16 Councilman Troyer?

17 MR. TROYER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
18 Through the chair to the service director, Mr. Cayet,
19 I'm trying to get some numbers together as far as
20 sanitation goes. Could you provide me with a breakdown
21 of how many employees -- well, first of all, how many
22 employees, I understand that there are like six
23 employees designated for sanitation; is that correct?

24 MR. CAYET: It depends on what day it is.

25 MR. TROYER: Okay. Roughly. I mean, what

1 do you go from, six to eight? Or do you go from four to
2 six?

3 MR. CAYET: There is always at least five,
4 and when we have bulk Monday there is 11.

5 MR. TROYER: Okay. All right. And then
6 what I would like to have is a breakdown of how many
7 employees and where these employees are working if not
8 actually on sanitation. Well, mostly how many, you
9 know -- according to my understanding is we budget for
10 six employees \$511,000. So what I need is a breakdown
11 of, on those six how many are actually -- how much time
12 is not spent on sanitation. Or in your other scenario
13 is I know that the street sweeper is budgeted for one
14 person. I believe it's \$86,000 and, you know, we know
15 that they're not sweeping the roads all the time and you
16 mentioned that they work sanitation sometimes. So what
17 I'm looking for is a breakdown of how many hours are
18 actually spent on sanitation on a monthly -- over the
19 year and on a monthly basis. And so that's what I'm
20 looking for on that. So is there any chance you can get
21 that for me?

22 MR. CAYET: Through the chair to Councilman
23 Troyer, send a memo to the Mayor and we'll take a look
24 at it.

25 MR. TROYER: Okay. Thank you.

1 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Councilman
2 Mencini?

3 MR. MENCINI: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
4 Through the chair to Lou, did you go over these
5 numbers already that my colleague Mr. Troyer is talking
6 about? Haven't we kind of covered that already a little
7 bit?

8 MR. CAYET: I believe we have.

9 MR. MENCINI: All right. That's all I have,
10 Mr. Chairman. Thank you.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Thank you. We'll
12 move to the Safety Director, Mr. Byrnes.

13 Mr. Byrnes: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. In
14 answer to a couple of questions that were generated
15 today, on the Fry Road Construction, the initial day
16 or two that was set up did cause some confusion. We
17 had an officer warn people and site some people that
18 traveled the wrong way. But largely since that first
19 day it has been virtually problem free that I'm aware
20 of. I don't think there's been any complaints since then.

21 The neighbors, the people that live on those
22 roads are greatly inconvenienced by the construction and
23 they have managed to work out a system that seems to
24 work for them. We have do not enter at both ends of the
25 street to try to minimize the non-local traffic. And my

1 understanding is at least since that initial period of
2 time that director talked about, there hasn't been any
3 problems on Fry that I'm aware of.

4 On the issue of the Central Dispatching,
5 that is still proceeding. The technical problems are
6 being worked out. In the last meeting I spoke about a
7 tentative possible date in the beginning of November.
8 That still looks very, very good. One of the problems
9 we're having now is we really can't do -- we really
10 can't do it until after the presidential election
11 because of the fact we have so many candidates coming
12 into Brook Park, landing their airplane in Hopkins, and
13 we need to close off some streets. So we want to
14 have some time to make sure that the communication works
15 and that it's not a problem, and probably the best time
16 to do that is probably after the 8th. But it's going to
17 be completed shortly. I don't know of any other road
18 blocks right now. Everything else seems to be working.
19 Okay. That completes my report, Mr. Chairman.

20 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Thank you. Any
21 questions for the safety director? Councilman Mencini?

22 MR. MENCINI: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
23 Dave, you're probably pretty right about that part about
24 not a lot of complaints about Fry Road. And really
25 you're probably right. In the beginning maybe a little

1 bit on that Sylvia to Cynthia a little bit there was,
 2 it's been tidied up, and the traffic flow has really
 3 slowed down. The issue we're having a little bit
 4 is off on the secondary streets off there that
 5 would maybe be **Alvin** and Barbara Lane,
 6 **Delores** is kind of a cut through a little bit.
 7 Again, I would say maybe I had my ears to the
 8 ground this weekend a little bit, and I mean,
 9 maybe the cutting through, speeding, things of
 10 that sort. On that, before I go any further, our
 11 police are doing a great job. I know they have
 12 their hands full. I talk to them guys. I see what
 13 they do. They have their hands full. But I did
 14 hear a few times about maybe stop sign blowing
 15 and things of that sort. I put in a memo so, you
 16 know, out in front of that rec center. I mean, feel
 17 free to go stand there. Go park back by the
 18 rubbish dumpsters any time you feel free and you
 19 will just see, you're better off putting a yield sign
 20 up there. But on that, now that you know that, but
 21 on that, overall they do a great, great job. But I'm
 22 just saying on that secondary's after Fry Road,
 23 maybe even over on that Michael between
 24 Hummel and Snow where some of this other
 25 construction, they'll take them other side streets.
 I probably heard it about three or four or five
 times this Sunday along over on **Alvin**. So just
 so know

1 thank you for that, too.
 2 MR. Byrnes: Well, thank you. I'll pass
 3 that on to the night shift because they're the ones that
 4 took care of it. I talked to the sergeant about it and
 5 I'll pass it on tomorrow.
 6 MR. SCOTT: Okay. Thanks.
 7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Councilman Troyer?
 8 MR. TROYER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
 9 Through the chair to the Safety Director, Mr. Byrnes,
 10 did I hear that you said for the dispatch November 8th;
 11 right?
 12 MR. Byrnes: Yes. Well, I said after the
 13 election.
 14 MR. TROYER: Okay. So not definite but soon
 15 after.
 16 MR. Byrnes: It certainly won't be on
 17 Election Day, Councilman. I can assure you of that.
 18 that I can promise you.
 19 MR. TROYER: Got you. I have some
 20 information I'm looking for. One is we talked about, we
 21 are talking about dispatch. I would just like a
 22 breakdown of how many hours this year, breakdown of how
 23 many hours this year police spent on dispatch. How many
 24 hours this year fire spent on dispatch. Also on police,
 25 how many hours this year police spent in the corrections

1 you know. It's not a complaint. It's not anything of
2 that sort. It's just letting you know; okay?

3 MR. Byrnes: Okay.

4 MR. MENCINI: I appreciate that. That's all
5 I have, Mr. Chairman.

6 MR. Byrnes: Can I respond?

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Mr. Byrnes, please.

8 MR. Byrnes: I think, Councilman, the same
9 thing happened last summer during the Smith Road
10 construction. People will use another route. So
11 naturally because Fry is a busy street, there is an
12 increase in traffic on the side roads. Our police have
13 done, are doing a good job trying to keep up with that.
14 But I think this is a temporary situation that will
15 correct itself. But I'm aware of the fact that the side
16 streets are impacted when you close a major road. We've
17 had that problem last summer and again this summer, but
18 they tend to correct themselves. Thank you.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Councilman Scott?

20 MR. SCOTT: Dave, thank you and thank the
21 officers for taking care of that parking issue on
22 Sheldon Road. Finally, the phone calls have stopped
23 and I appreciate it. Every day I was going there at
24 10:30, 11:00 at night to double check and finally that's
25 stopped so thanks. Thank them for -- the residents

1 department. And also as far as the STOP program goes,
2 can we get a report on, you know, when did we start the
3 STOP program, how many hours is spent on it every month
4 and last year or every year since we started it and, you
5 know, just an idea of how many hours are spent on the
6 STOP program. Preferably monthly but a year would be
7 fine, too. That's it. Thank you.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: **Go ahead Mr. Byrnes.**

9 MR. Byrnes: Councilman, I'm not sure how to
10 answer that. A lot of that information is not available
11 or it's already been folded into the budget when you
12 pass the budget at the beginning of the year. I can
13 tell you that we have part time jailers, however the
14 police do their own booking. There is some overlap of
15 services there. I'll do the best I can. But I would, I
16 think to answer you more succinctly, I would rather you
17 would reduce that to writing and send it to the mayor's
18 office and hopefully he'll share it with me and I can
19 answer as best I can, but that's quite a lot of detail
20 for us to research but we'll certainly give it a shot.
21 But I think you should send that to the mayor though.
22 Thank you.

23 MR. TROYER: Okay. Thank you. I will do
24 that. I will put the proper memos in, and then I can
25 ask the Mayor about it every other week. Thank you.

1 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Council, any other
2 questions of the Safety Director? Seeing none we'll
3 move to the Law Director, Mrs. Horvath.

4 MRS. HORVATH: Thank you very much, Mr.
5 Chairman. Yesterday I had distributed a legal opinion
6 with regard to some of the items on our current agenda.
7 I just wanted to note that, other than that one particular
8 item I have no further report.

9 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: All right. Council, any
10 questions to the Law Director. Councilman Troyer?

11 MR. TROYER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
12 Through the chair to the Law Director, Madam Law
13 Director, are we going to have a monthly report soon?

14 MRS. HORVATH: With regard to a monthly
15 report I assume you're talking about pending cases?

16 MR. TROYER: Yes.

17 MRS. HORVATH: I'm sure you will very
18 shortly. We currently have one pending case. That
19 particular case has had very little movement up until
20 actually today. It was set for pretrial and continued
21 and continued. So based on the fact that there really
22 was nothing to report, you haven't had a report. But it
23 should be forthcoming very shortly because now things
24 are starting to happen in it.

25 MR. TROYER: Great. Thank you.

1 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Seeing no other
2 questions, we'll move to the Finance Director, Mr.
3 Cingle.

4 MR. CINGLE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Just
5 one item tonight. The Finance Department appreciates
6 council's consideration of Ordinance 10038-2016 that's on
7 Second Reading tonight. That concludes my report.

8 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Council, any
9 questions for the Finance Director? Councilwoman
10 McCormick?

11 MS. MCCORMICK: Okay. The September report
12 that we received showed \$36,000 moved from part-time
13 salaries to full-time salaries in the recreation\$
14 department. Whereas August 1st showed that 36,000 in
15 the full time. My question is; why is it in the monthly
16 report but it's not in the Ordinance that we're
17 considering tonight? We were told this was going to
18 happen in the future.

19 MR. CINGLE: Through the chair to
20 Councilwoman McCormick, the move from part-time salaries
21 to regular salaries does not need Council-manic action.
22 We were able to transfer those funds without Council
23 approval.

24 MS. MCCORMICK: Okay. Thank you.

25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Councilman Troyer?

1 MR. TROYER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
2 Through the chair to the Finance Director. Mr. Cingle,
3 I want to just mention something on what Councilwoman
4 McCormick just said. I understand you said it's okay to
5 do it that way, but wouldn't we want to have it on this
6 most recent amendment to the budget since we already did
7 it on your monthly statements? Wouldn't it behoove us to
8 have it in this recent change, amendment to the budget?

9 MR. CINGLE: Through the chair to Councilman
10 Troyer, there aren't any changes proposed to the
11 Recreation Department under Ordinance 1038-2016.

12 MR. TROYER: Okay. Because, so you're
13 saying just because you don't really have to do it, you
14 don't really have to list it. Okay, I got you.

15 So continue on through the chair again to
16 the Finance Director Mr. Cingle, we have on the
17 agenda tonight **Luni-Wurz** project. Basically they're
18 going to build a new building to replace a building that
19 they're going to then tear down the old building. Now
20 there is some speculation. I'm hearing different
21 numbers about how many employees are moving. The
22 original, the grant said 14 employees. I talked to the
23 owners who said 14 employees, and then the other day
24 somebody said 12 employees. So what I'm getting at is,
25 correct me if I'm wrong, but this is going to be covered

1 under the Cleveland Water Department's anti-poaching
2 agreement. This would be the first business we'd be
3 bringing in because it's coming from Cleveland; is that
4 correct? And how is that going to affect this deal? If
5 going to be based on 12, 14? Do we have a number of
6 employees? And do you have a number on that how much
7 we're going to have to give back? Do we collect the
8 money first and then we remit it back to Cleveland? How
9 is that all going to work with that anti-poaching
10 agreement?

11 MR. CINGLE: Through the chair to Councilman
12 Troyer, if any monies need to be remitted back to
13 Cleveland we would collect those first, reconcile the
14 dollar amount and then remit the dollars back to the
15 City of Cleveland. We will work through the Economic
16 Development Commissioner to coordinate the remittance
17 of funds if necessary.

18 MR. TROYER: Okay. All right. Thank you.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Councilman Mencini?

20 MR. MENCINI: Through the chair to the
21 Finance Director, Greg, on that poaching agreement,
22 would we have to go to Cleveland and give them
23 something? Is that a done deal or would I have to ask
24 Mike that?

25 MR. CINGLE: Through the chair to Councilman

1 Mencini, I will ask Mike tomorrow when I see him, and
 2 just to get further understanding if any dollars are
 3 going to have to be remitted back to the City of
 4 Cleveland. Because we have to properly account for that
 5 in the income tax department budget. So I'll work with
 6 him tomorrow, sit down with him tomorrow and properly
 7 review this and I will get back to you once I have some
 8 information.

9 MR. MENCINI: Okay. Thank you. Bless you,
 10 Frank. That's all I have, Mr. Chairman.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Any other
 12 questions of the Finance Director?

13 Okay. Seeing no more questions that
 14 completes items under letter I. We'll move to letter J
 15 which is Other Communications and Petitions and
 16 verbal approval (Introduction of New Legislation). I
 17 think we have several items of legislation to be
 18 introduced. Okay. We have a Resolution urging a
 19 Federal Aviation Administration to have a Community
 20 meeting with the City of Brook Park in reference to the
 21 flight paths at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport
 22 and declaring an emergency. This is introduced by
 23 Councilman Burgio. We'll place this in the Aviation
 24 and Environmental committee.

25 We have An

1 Ordinance authorizing the City of Brook Park to provide
 2 a Job Retention Business Expansion and Grant to James C.
 3 and Mary Ann White to facilitate the retention and
 4 expansion of Blue Line Rentals, 16000 Brookpark Road,
 5 Ohio and declaring an emergency Introduced by Mayor
 6 Coyne. We will place this in the Finance Committee.

7 We have a Resolution urging the Ohio
 8 Department of Transportation to name the Snow Road
 9 Bridge Overpass the Veterans Memorial Bridge and
 10 declaring an emergency. This is introduced by
 11 Councilman Salvatore and Mayor Coyne, Councilman Scott,
 12 Burgio and Mencini, Councilman Salvatore has asked me to
 13 do this under the provision in our Charter and
 14 Council Rules that allows it to go to the floor of
 15 tonight's meeting. So this will be placed on tonight's
 16 agenda under letter M, First Reading number 3. And
 17 it will appear as Resolution 37-2016. It will also be,

24 MAYOR COYNE: Mr. Chairman, Point of Order.
 25 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: What's your point of

2 MAYOR COYNE: Point of order is as the President of
 3 Council, you are not to initiate debate on any subject, and
 4 you're making comments, first of all, the original statement is
 5 not true. There is no legislation needed to appropriate the
 6 monies for this contract because you did that when we passed
 7 the original contract. And I don't think Council wants to sit
 8 here for another two hours to listen to this. So your original
 9 statement is not true.

10 Secondly, and most importantly, you can't
 11 initiate debate, you can summarize debate. That's my
 12 Point of Order.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. As far as your
 14 point of order about the statement not being true,
 15 that's actually not a valid point of order. You're not
 16 talking about any rule being violated. As far as not
 17 being able to initiate any debate, I am simply
 18 explaining why this is coming in as emergency
 19 legislation so that Council and also the residents
 20 would understand why it's going to the --

21 MAYOR COYNE: Thank you, Mr.
 22 Chairman. Your original statement is not factual.

23 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Again, that has nothing
 24 to do with your Point of Order. There's no violation
 25

1 there --

2 **MAYOR COYNE:** Thank you.

3 **COUNCIL PRESIDENT:** --- so there is no

4 violation there.

5 So to finish off the explanation, the fact

6 that it's on verbal approval, I just wanted to, you

7 know, it's important that it goes on tonight's agenda

8 really because of the time factor also. This is going

9 to be something that as the law director stated in her

10 report she issued it, things, a memo saying -- it

11 already being in effect because of the 30 days. However,

12 the payment is going to be made beginning of December so

13 we need to have something that authorizes that payment

14 and this is a -- this is an avenue for it to go through.

15 The other aspect that I wanted to explain

16 why it's coming through this process is also because

17 council is aware of this and such that there was three

18 separate requests that were put in on September 15th,

5 officials to be offensive and threatening, threatening was

6 added in.

7 **MR. SALVATORE:** All that stuff is already in the

8 rule. Each citizen shall at all times

9 during any regular or special meeting conduct themselves

10 in a professional manner. That's in the rule now.

11 **MR. ASTORINO:** It's not in rule 19. According to

12 what I have on my agenda]--

13 **MR. MENCINI:** threatening was the word.

14 **MR. SALVATORE:** So there was only one word

15 that was changed?

16 **MR. MENCINI:** Yes.

17 **MR. SALVATORE:** So all we're changing is we're

18 -- actually, we're not even changing a word

19 we're just adding the word.

20 **MR. ASTORINO:** And it deleted out the second

21 to last sentence of the first one, too.

22 **MR. SALVATORE:** We must be reading two

23 different things because all mine shows is adding

24 one word after offensive--

25

1 legislation that has been requested four previous times

2 but has been refused by the law director to act upon

3 that request.

4 So the reason that it's going onto the

5 agenda is because of that. There are various reasons

6 that we discussed already. So again, it's going to item

7 M4 Ordinance number 10048-2016.

8 That concluded the items that are being

9 introduced, so we will move to the next items that are

10 on the agenda which is under Verbal Approval. We

11 have an amendment to Council Rule number 19.

12 **MR. TROYER:** Move to adopt.

13 **MS. McCORMICK:** Support.

14 **COUNCIL PRESIDENT:** Okay. There is a motion

15 to adopt the amendment to Council Rule 19. It has been

16 properly supported. Another discussion? Seeing no

17 discussion, we'll call the roll.

18 **MR. SALVATORE:** Mr. Chairman, may I

19 comment? Just briefly, all we're changing is one word;

20 correct? According to what I'm reading you're only

21 adding the word threatening; correct?

22 **COUNCIL PRESIDENT:** From the rule that was,

23 this is the amended as it was presented originally. The

24 original rule has more on it. It's the original rule as

25 it exists right now for Rule 19 actually stops, if you

1 **MR. ASTORINO:** If you look above,

2 Councilman, it says there is a sentence there that says

3 they shall not personally attack, either physically or

4 verbally, any elected or appointed official, and that

5 was deleted out. That's being deleted out of it.

6 **MR. ASTORINO:** Hold on.

7 **MR. SALVATORE:** So we eliminated you can't

8 attack anybody physically or verbally?

9 **COUNCIL PRESIDENT:** That was deleted out at

10 the Caucus meeting.

11 **MR. SALVATORE:** So we're taking that out, so

12 you're allowed to attack physically --

13 **MR. MENCINI:** Hopefully that will never

14 happen so...

15 **COUNCIL PRESIDENT:** If you remember last

16 week when we had this discussion, the law director

17 raised a question about that and Councilman Mencini

18 actually had some discussion about whether or not

19 verbally attacked or physically attacked, how do we

20 define verbally attacked. And to refresh your memory

21 that was kind of like where I made mention about the

22 judge talking about the definition. I may not know how

23 to define it but I know it if I see it. We had that

24 discussion last week. So it's not that it's allowing

25 them to do that. It's just, there was concern by the

1 law director that was raised and Councilman Mencini expressed
2 some concerns because of that. And so
3 there was a motion to take that out of it.

4 **MR. SALVATORE:** Mr. Chairman, if I
5 may, I still haven't changed my position. I still feel
6 the way it was before, which is using the word offensive
7 language, it puts the determination of what category the
8 offense is coming from in the hands of the chair. By
9 adding the word threatening, I think we limit ourselves
10 to only threatening comments rather than offensive
11 language being someone who is at the microphone
12 swearing. That would put the responsibility of the
13 chair to use this rule under offensive language, and now
14 you have offensive threatening language. So I think
15 we're actually weakening Rule 19 by adding in the word
16 threatening. It's already covered. And in rule 19
17 taking out the other section of -- all of this stuff is
18 in there for a reason and it's worked over the years. I
19 don't see any reason to change it now. But that's my
20 position. Thank you.

21 **COUNCIL PRESIDENT:** Councilman McCormick?
22 **MS. MCCORMICK:** I was the one who made the
23 motion at the last -- at the Caucus meeting to insert
24 the word threatening in there. It was supposed to be
25 offensive or threatening, and the "or" is not reflected

1 **MR. BURGIO:** As it is -- the way it's stated or
2 in the amendment?

3 **COUNCIL PRESIDENT:** The way it's stated on
4 your agenda where it says it's hereby amended to read.

5 **MR. TROYER:** That was going to be with the
6 "or."

7 **MS. MCCORMICK:** With the "or."

8 **COUNCIL PRESIDENT:** With the "or" being that
9 it's a typo.

10 **MR. BURGIO:** That's why I asked.

11 **CLERK:** Troyer?

12 **MR. TROYER:** Yes.

13 **CLERK:** McCormick?

14 **MS. MCCORMICK:** Yes.

15 **CLERK:** Powers?

16 **MRS. POWERS:** Yes.

17 **Clerk:** Mencini?

7 supposed to be the word "or."

8 **MR. TROYER:** Probably and/or. MS.

9 **MCCORMICK:** As I made it, it was or.

12 **MRS. HORVATH:** Yes. Just for purposes of
13 clarification, right now rule 19 is one short paragraph.

17 paragraph. So just for clarity sake, I can provide
18 Councilman Salvatore with my copy of the current rule

22 **COUNCIL PRESIDENT:** Okay. Is there any

 11 violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of a

1 animal to go beyond the premises of such owner or keeper
2 at any time, except when held securely on a leash or
3 under the control of some responsible person."

4 Well, I walked my dog about six weeks ago
5 around the corner. The dog was loose. The dog came up
6 to my dog. And my dog, her name is Annie by the way,
7 nice dog, she started to get a little aggressive and I
8 pulled her back because I don't know if dogs are
9 friendly and why people let them loose. But when I
10 pulled her back, all her weight hit my knee. So my knee
11 has been bummed up for the last six weeks. I have a
12 torn meniscus or whatever --

13 **MR. MENCINI:** Meniscus.

14 **MS. BARBOUR:** -- in my knee and the ortho., Dr.
15 Banks, said it's got time, it needs time to heal. But I
16 have to keep doing things because my husband is not
17 doing well after his hip surgery and I got to cut the
18 grass and do this and help Mrs. Powers and things like
19 that. It's just what I chose to do, so I have to bear
20 the pain. So I don't feel safe. So I was walking in the
21 MetroParks but that cost money. Unless you guys
22 want to give me money for gas.

23 So then another incident this happened this
24 Sunday. On my street on Robert Drive a dog was loose
25 but I didn't see it. I have one of those carriers, you

1 cable wires. I do not know what cable company. And
2 they finally picked it up. Then there is another one
3 here. This is when I would walk Brook Park. This is
4 the same one. They let it hanging like that.

5 You know this is not good for safety for
6 kids, you know? See? See audience? There. See? So
7 this is -- we got to do something about them. Either
8 when somebody gets a cable or goes to Direct TV or
9 whatever, maybe we should start fining these cable
10 companies for the cleanup or come back. I mean, some
11 residents just don't care. I do because it's a safety
12 issue. Here is another one that was for the same area
13 but the guy, they must have called. Now this one is
14 down the street and it's still hanging. We kind of
15 bunched it up. But if you see if this picture when I
16 pass it around, he cut has lawn up to it. But now he
17 bunched it up and it's still there. And here is another
18 one. And then there is another one on Smith Road across
19 from Brookgate, and that's been hanging on it for a long,
20 long time. Tacky. I mean, doesn't anyone care about the
21 city? I do. I do. Because our city should
22 be C and above. If you want to grade us. We should
23 have no weeds, steps need -- as walking through the
24 city, steps need to be fixed, nipped and tucked if you
25 want to say that and it's like, it's deplorable. And

1 then we get section 8 people coming in and don't care,
2 and then you don't want to enforce the owners of them.
3 I rather prefer someone that comes into the community
4 and buys the house. And least it makes our city more
5 presentable.

6 Okay. I think I got some pictures about
7 sewer drains. I haven't seen, I did have some pictures
8 of sewer drains. Maybe I don't have them. Well, I did
9 have a couple here. Here it is. I haven't seen the
10 street sweeper in a long, long team. I don't know if it
11 is he out of order, Mr. Cayet, this is, look how this
12 looks. A lot of grass and everything. I mean, how is
13 the water going to drain, you know? This is tacky
14 stuff. I mean, maybe some of the Council people should
15 drive around the city. I walk but not anymore since I'm
16 in the cemetery. Yeah, you could see that, sir. I
17 mean, it's like. Is it broke? I mean, I think I seen
18 it all during the summer one time coming down. I know
19 you're short staffed, but maybe we should, you start
20 going around and sweeping up that stuff. And let's see,
21 what's my other thing I want I want to say. All right.

22 So I think that's all I want to say. I just
23 care about my city. And I think all you should, too.
24 So maybe you can work on those things. As far as the
25 cable things. I don't know what to say but that one is

1 still hanging. It's all bunched up. And really I think
2 it's maybe more responsible for the residents say well,
3 come on and get this rid of this cable so it doesn't
4 look so tacky. So these are my remarks. I don't know
5 what you can do about the dogs, if you're going to add
6 an ordinance or amendment, but like I said, I should be
7 feeling, I should be safe to walk my dog and I'm not
8 safe. So Holy Cross, been, going to be doing that.
9 Unless they kick me out of that, too. Okay. Everyone
10 have a good evening and that's about it.

11 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Thank you.

12 MS. BARBOUR: Anyone want to see these
13 pictures?

14 MAYOR COYNE: You can give them to the service
15 director. I'd appreciate it.

16 MS. REYNOLDS: Brandi Reynolds, 6060
17 Middlebrook Boulevard. I just wanted to address about
18 the live stream. The live stream had been working
19 perfectly for the past four weeks. The issue with the
20 live stream was not the service and not the person, it
21 was the cable company that the city has. And
22 unfortunately, the cable company had dropped the ball
23 many times when the Mayor and Patty and many other
24 people tried to get them out to fix the issues, they
25 would say okay, we're coming and then didn't show up or

1 said that they would be here after hours and didn't
2 really understand what we were needing. So as of right
3 now the live stream has been work perfectly, like I said
4 for the past four weeks.

5 Before that I was using my own data and my
6 own cellular network to live stream or Facebook live the
7 meetings. Some people couldn't see those because I'm
8 blocked by a lot of people on Facebook. However, I
9 tried to share them to multiple pages to make sure that
10 if the feed for any reason was bad or skipping that my
11 feed would be much better because I was using my own
12 network and I didn't have to plug in to the wireless
13 network here. So I was doing that throughout the summer
14 and I was also doing audio also for a couple of meetings
15 I should say. And I also put on Facebook and stuff if
16 anybody wanted those things I could send them. I can't
17 send anybody the Facebook live stuff because it's not a
18 file or anything that you can download. If you're my
19 friend on Facebook or if, you know, put it out there as
20 a public thing then you can see it. Otherwise there is
21 no way for me to back it up, save it, send it to
22 somebody else.

23 The only other thing that I have to say is
24 we're almost into November now. And it's a constant
25 every day it seems like the trench between the middle is

1 deeper and deeper. And I come to the meetings now
2 because I do the livestream and I could see it. And I
3 just wish that instead of digging this trench so deep
4 that it's getting filled better. You know, one side is
5 not getting invited to an event and one side is not
6 getting the paperwork. It's just kind of like poking
7 the bear. And me and Mr. Troyer had a conversation
8 about poking the bear, a couple of weeks ago and it was
9 just something that happened that didn't need to happen
10 but it did. You know, it could have just been left
11 alone. And I think that a lot of times, you know, the
12 back and forth doesn't need to happen. It's just a
13 consensus. I can see the frustration in some of your
14 eyes that we just need to get the ball rolling.

15 So that's all I have to say. And if there
16 is any more questions about the live stream I sit in the
17 corner for hours? You can just see me over there.
18 Thank you.

19 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Thank you.

20 MS. SAYERS: Liz Sayers, 23065 Cedar Point
21 Road, Brook Park, Ohio. I just dressed like this
22 because I wanted to make sure I cover my tail here.

23 MR. ASTORINO: Liz, we can't hear you. You
24 have to speak into the mic.

25 MS. SAYERS: I just want -- I'm dressed like

1 this because I wanted to cover my tail in case anything
2 goes wrong or I get misinterpreted or whatever.

3 What I have to say is I just was concerned
4 over the phones and the laptops and all of that that was
5 discussed and somebody wants them up there. And I also
6 just want to cover, I just want to clarify to everybody
7 that I did not get arrested; okay? There was a police
8 report made on me. It was dropped. It's over and done
9 with. But I dressed like this to cover myself just in
10 case it might happen again. My concerns are I just
11 don't want -- you're supposed to all talk to each other,
12 pay attention to each other, all of the concerns of the
13 city and everything and show respect towards each other
14 and everything. I'll show it too if you show it to me.

15 Last week -- my name isn't she, my name is
16 Liz. And I just want to cover that I did not go behind
17 people. I wasn't spying on people. I came up to,
18 whatever you want to call you, up there when you were on
19 a five-minute break and started talking. I got a little
20 offended and saw the gentleman get a little offended
21 when we asked Mr. Troyer a question when you guys were
22 out here on the floor talking. He got all upset with me
23 for being up there.

24 But if you're going to address me, where I
25 can't come back and talk, you know, you're going to say

1 it to my face, but don't go by she. My name is Liz. And
2 I didn't appreciate some of the remarks. Just like you
3 don't appreciate some of the remarks I say about all of
4 you. And you don't attack my family or kids or
5 anybody else. I don't attack your families or anybody
6 else. I just want to make it perfectly clear. I have
7 five grown adults. I have a Marine, fire fighter,
8 police officer, I have one that owns their own business
9 and one works for a big company. I am in the medical
10 field. I am an assigning notary. If you understand the
11 definition of that. For 44 years. One thing a mother
12 does not like, don't attack my family. Don't attack me,
13 because I attack back.

14 Now I just get concerned about to the
15 rudeness up here, you know, that everybody is writing or
16 looking the other way or have other issues to deal with
17 when somebody is up here. That's why I come up here to
18 discuss about the phones and laptops that you guys want
19 and whatever. I think that's disrespectful because I
20 think all you need to look at each other, work out the
21 issues of the city and learn how communicate; okay? Now
22 I got to watch every word I say, how I say it and look
23 at you when you're talking to me. Now I would expect
24 the same thing; okay? I don't care what anybody did
25 last week, I don't care what anybody does, but don't

1 attack me unless you go, hey, Liz. You got a problem
2 with me, hey, Liz. Don't sit up here and go she, she,
3 she, she, she, she; okay?

4 As far as my family is concerned, don't go
5 there with my family. I don't care who you are. And
6 like I said, I'm a six pack. There are five boys.
7 They're men. 43 down to 34. Don't ever associate me
8 with kids. And start, you know, communicating better.
9 But I don't believe you guys should have a laptop and
10 phones up there, because as I understand, by the city
11 council president, that there shouldn't be any of those
12 up there. Michelle makes sure you guys all have your
13 paperwork. Has everything up there to discuss,
14 everything you need to discuss about the city, and about
15 issues with what's going on with city. And I appreciate
16 that you're all looking at me for a change and you're
17 not playing around on phones and cell phones and you're
18 not yacking at each other and whispering. You want
19 respect from all of us? Then you got to give it, too.
20 And like I said. I came prepared tonight just in case I
21 might have slipped up and said something that you
22 misinterpreted. And if you got a problem with me, like
23 I said before, you could say it to me. To my face.
24 Just like I say it to yours.

25 You guys all have a nice evening, and if you

1 got anything to say to me I'm still standing here. But
2 thank for listening. And like I said, you got a problem
3 with me I would really appreciate you talk to me instead
4 of behind my back or go and do something foolish, what
5 happened last time. And thank you for dropping the
6 charges.

7 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Seeing no, one
8 else coming to the podium we'll come back up here to the
9 desk. Councilwoman McCormick?

10 MS. MCCORMICK: I'd like to make a motion
11 for Council and anybody to respond.

12 MR. MENCINI: Support.

13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. There has been a
14 motion to allow council to respond. Properly supported.
15 Clerk, please call the roll.

16 CLERK: McCormick?

17 MS. MCCORMICK: Yes.

18 CLERK: Mencini?

19 MR. MENCINI: Yes.

20 CLERK: Scott?

21 MR. SCOTT: Yes.

22 CLERK: Burgio?

23 MR. BURGIO: Yes.

24 CLERK: Salvatore.

25 MR. SALVATORE: Yes.

1 CLERK: Troyer?
 2 MR. TROYER: Yes.
 3 CLERK: Powers?
 4 MRS. POWERS: Yes.
 5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Motion has been
 6 approved. Council can respond to the comments that were
 7 made by the audience. Councilwoman McCormick?
 8 MS. MCCORMICK: I just wanted to thank all
 9 the residents who came out tonight to our meeting, and
 10 all of those who came to the podium to offer us some
 11 constructive feedback. It was good to get that
 12 information from you guys. And while I have the floor I
 13 had one comment the I wanted to offer to the Mayor about
 14 Vet day.
 15 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Speak in the mic.
 16 MS. MCCORMICK: About Veterans Day, National
 17 Veterans Awareness Week. I should have mentioned it
 18 before but I forgot. The lights on the gazebo, is there
 19 any chance that we could do red, white and blue to kind
 20 of celebrate the veterans?
 21 MAYOR COYNE: We'll have to see if Mr. Cayet
 22 in the store room has various lights but I'm sure we can
 23 make a great effort.
 24 MAYOR COYNE: We're doing pink for
 25 October. Your event is in November?

1 MS. MCCORMICK: Yes. That would be
 2 November. It's the same week as the General
 3 Election.
 4 MAYOR COYNE: Yeah. We'll make
 5 those arrangements. Unfortunately, we had vandalism
 6 again over the weekend. The busted out a bunch of those
 7 sockets that hold those bulbs, so maybe Mr. Cingle can
 8 find me some money I can buy some new sockets. But the
 9 vandalism over the weekend was here, in front of Council
 10 and the side of the rec center.
 11 MS. MCCORMICK: That's all. Just thank you
 12 for coming out tonight.
 13 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Thank you.
 14 Councilman Mencini?
 15 MR. MENCINI: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I
 16 also, too, I appreciate everybody coming. You know, me,
 17 when you get to the mic I like giving answers and I also
 18 enjoy you guys coming up. As I said before, I like
 19 criticism and I also like to be prompt. I'll go with Frank
 20 first. Frank, on the streets, you're absolutely right. I
 21 know weather, we get everything. We get winter, we get
 22 snow plows on them, we got trucks on Snow Road. I
 23 wish that there was something that we didn't have to mess
 24 with our streets. I think that's going to be, after the rec
 25 center, I think we're getting out little housing and

1 regardless of what people are saying, but I think those streets
 2 are going to be next. Right over where you
 3 live, right over off **Paulding, Delores** is terrible. Am I
 4 right? Absolutely. Is Sylvia bad? Snow Road?
 5 Absolutely. So, yeah. I wish there was something we
 6 could do. You're saying do this, do that. Some things
 7 we're probably going to look into. But my point on it
 8 is, I just wish there was a solution for our streets
 9 that for all probably Northwest Counties who get the
 10 severe weather and get the heat in the summer that we
 11 had something for our streets where he would have to
 12 face this problem with a single street, one out of 50 years
 13 instead of maybe one out of 20 or 30 because I got a lot
 14 of bad ones in my ward, and will be coming around
 15 pretty soon.
 16 I want to go to Sue. Sue, you brought a lot
 17 of things up. One of the things you said is do you
 18 drive around and absolutely I do, and I did a lot of it.
 19 Clerk, do you not get a lot of memos from me?
 20 CLERK: Yes.
 21 MR. MENCINI: Thank you. A lot of them. We
 22 can't catch everything. It's good that you guys bring
 23 it. That's important. I get a lot of calls and people
 24 tell me, Jimmy, this here or this is cracked here, or
 25 this is, you know grass grown here, and we do react to

1 them. I'll say one thing of my partners up here, my
 2 colleagues, they do a pretty good job with that. But
 3 speaking for myself, and probably for most of my
 4 colleagues, we do get out pretty good.
 5 I agree with you with the Facebook, too.
 6 And I agree with you in the effect to do something. We
 7 have the mentoring group. We have the beautification.
 8 We have the block watch. We have a lot of things. We
 9 have flower planting. I could go on and on, but you
 10 don't want to be bored. There's a lot of things for
 11 people to do in this community. That always should just
 12 fall back up to the mayor or council president and
 13 council and it should be; a good community is community
 14 based. I mean, end of story on that. You know, and I'm
 15 glad you do what you do and everything, and its good
 16 that you walk around because I do see you walking around
 17 but...The dogs. The dogs, yeah. Well, I think
 18 the mayor already said there is three dogs up to every
 19 house. And when you walk, run, like for an election or
 20 you go door to door as we do, you would see that. There
 21 is a lot of pets. I think that's one of the things
 22 maybe after the streets, the kennel will be something
 23 we're going to have to look at. And I agree with you.
 24 We just had, two weeks ago, somebody brought in a
 25

1 Doberman. One of our parents and then somebody brings a Great
 2 Dane across the way. I thought man, our football
 3 team is here, six, seven, eight, nine, ten, year old and
 4 kids at the playground. Not good. You know, so there
 5 is probably some things we probably could look at when
 6 you say that dogs are loose and this and that. I think
 7 (inaudible) overall does a pretty good job as much as he
 8 is there.

9 But, you know, there's few things we have to
 10 look at and I'll cover that where Mrs. Reynolds was kind
 11 of at. I wish she was over there holding a TV camera.
 12 I wish we had the best equipment that we could give her
 13 to film these. And, you know unfortunately look at the
 14 building. Look at, I mean, it's old. It's dated. I'm
 15 sure Brandy will tell you some are connected when she is
 16 doing her live stream. It just takes a little bit of
 17 interference and there is a problem from what I've been
 18 told. If I stand corrected, if there is a little
 19 interference in here or over there or, you know, there is
 20 a problem with the live stream. And there was one
 21 more thing I wanted to hit.

22 The cable, you talked about the cables. I get
 23 that a lot. And unfortunately now in today's day and
 24 age, maybe Ed (Piatak) could cover that a little more,
 25 it's just always cable. There's phone wires. There's

1 electrical wires. There is so many up there. When the poles
 2 get hit and they put a new pole in, if somebody
 3 wants to correct me on this they can. It takes quite a
 4 while. Yeah, they're waiting for the pole to set, but
 5 they got to go in some type of chronological order for
 6 these companies to come and one cable's got to come, the
 7 phone company got to come, the electric's got to come.
 8 It's a long process. So you're, I've had them wires
 9 hanging. I don't like it either, you know. But there
 10 is a process and it's not like we can just send guys and
 11 say hey, go clip that wire off the line. I mean, it
 12 just doesn't work like that. And that's about it.

13 And let me go to Liz really quick and I'm
 14 done. Liz, love you honey. I know you get a little
 15 worked up there sometimes. And sometimes you do
 16 bring some good things up. That one day you brought up
 17 about the city having all the needs. And you don't even
 18 know you said it, but you were absolutely right. And
 19 them are the kind of things that we do want to hear. We
 20 want the public to hear, and we will start as we are now
 21 and as we have been addressing them needs. So that
 22 would be about it. So I appreciate you listening to me.
 23 I hope I gave some of you resolution but I had to
 24 respond. I sit here and I feel that I have to give
 25 that. So, but I appreciate all you for listening.

1 Thank you. That's all I have, Mr. Chairman.

2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Thank you. Councilwoman
 3 Powers?

4 MRS. POWERS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

5 First, I'd like to say to Frank Kosmerl, I agree with you
 6 that we do need a fair and equitable to get our share of
 7 the taxes. My other comment though is about
 8 tearing down the schools. We need those schools. They
 9 can be brought up-to-date a lot cheaper than you can tear
 10 one down and replace it. So for those people who say
 11 they're old and need to be taken down, I would like to
 12 say Evangeline Davies School, that is now a Marine
 13 base, and those two schools on Holland Road, and over on
 14 Elmdale are now nursing homes.

15 So I have a feeling that if the school board gets
 16 their way, they'll either take them down or they'll
 17 become nursing homes because we're an older community.
 18 And talking about being an older community, is not right
 19 to take these schools down or to even close them because
 20 children are supposed to be better educated if they've
 21 got enough space to spread out so they're not so crowded
 22 into one room or one school if it's overcrowding.
 23 Overcrowding takes away from the education process. So
 24 I think, and as we are an older community, as we become
 25 a younger community, we're going to have more children

1 e are going to need more schools not less. As far as Susan
 2 BARBOUR, thank you, Susan. You're -- she is a super
 3 worker. I mean, if she had her way and had the time,
 4 she would have every yard in Brook Park looking spic and
 5 span. And we've done more than, neighbor helping
 6 neighbor started out to be neighbor helping neighbor
 7 where you, when our children were growing up everyone
 8 knew everybody in the neighborhood. So it was to get
 9 people to get reacquainted with their neighbors.
 10 Especially now that we're an older community. So that
 11 we know who is supposed to be in the neighborhood and
 12 to be aware of who is in the neighborhood and so it
 13 would work kind of like a block watch. But we would be
 14 visiting with our neighbors more. And the neighbor
 15 helping neighbor part isn't just housework. It's little
 16 things like going to visit a shut in, going to do a little
 17 shopping trip for a shut in, taking a shut in out for
 18 coffee just because they can't drive and get out of the
 19 house anymore. Just little things that show your
 20 neighbors that you appreciate them and you're aware of
 21 them. So it isn't all hard work although we have done
 22 some pretty hard work. We know how to use a chainsaw
 23 and a weed whacker. You name it, we know how to do it,
 24 and yes, we have some very good help. And thank you,
 25 Jim. And I think that's

1 about all I have. Okay. Thank you.
 2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Thank you. Councilman
 3 Burgio?
 4 MR. BURGIO: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I too
 5 want to thank everybody for coming out. I wish all
 6 those chairs were filled with people but it does show me
 7 that you're interested in the community and that's
 8 appreciative. And I do respect all the input from Sue,
 9 Frank, Liz, thank you for all off your thoughts. I do
 10 listen to what you say. And especial thanks to Mrs.
 11 Reynolds and her husband for all the hard work they do
 12 every week. A lot of people don't see everything of
 13 what they do, and there's been time some of those
 14 things they've actually had to repair to keep it
 15 working. I know you're here three or four hours at
 16 least once a week. But it's a lot of effort and in some
 17 ways it's kind of a thankless job, but I see what they do
 18 and I really appreciate all that they do in live
 19 streaming because it's good to have that kind of a,
 20 getting the message out to people who can't make it to
 21 a council meeting. So I appreciate that. And I want to
 22 congratulate Mrs. Shick. I think you're going to do an
 23 outstanding job. I can't think of anybody better
 24 qualified, and I think that was a great choice. So I
 25 look forward to all of your input of the Recreation

1 Commission. And those are my thoughts. Thank you, Mr.
 2 Chairman.
 3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Councilman Scott?
 4 MR. SCOTT: I'll will be really quick.
 5 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Thank you.
 6 MR. SCOTT: First of all, to **MS. SCHICK**,
 7 Cindy, congratulations on your appointment, you'll do
 8 an outstanding job. To reiterate on Mr. Mencini' s
 9 comments, Susan, about the hanging cables, I had a call
 10 that took me approximately four weeks, six to eight
 11 phone calls to the cable company but it did get
 12 resolved. Contact your council person, get the address,
 13 have her make a phone call. If she needs a phone
 14 call -- Jan is your council person, or Tom or whatever
 15 it is. I've got a contact person for WOW cable. The
 16 district operation manager out of Columbus, he's a hell
 17 of a guy. He'll will work with you, but it does take
 18 time. Like I said, it took me four weeks and like six
 19 to eight phone calls, but it does get done. But it is a
 20 time consuming issue; okay? That's all. I said I was
 21 going to be short.
 22 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Thank you. Councilman
 23 Troyer?
 24 MR. TROYER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I
 25 have to get my two cents in. Ditto pretty much with what

everybody else says. I would just like to mention that,
 you know, don't only call one Councilman, you have three
 Council people at large here and you're going to have a
 much better chance if you're having four people make
 those phone calls than just the one. So keep in mind,
 you have four representatives up here. And I just want
 to thank everybody for coming, of course. That's part
 of the ditto, and Brandy thanks for going over and
 above and getting these meetings out there one way or
 another. That's it.
 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Mayor?
 MAYOR COYNE: Thank you very much. Mr.

 sure we'll be having great debates and about the
 republican and democratic platforms, at least you're
 reading them and looking at them and knowing the
 difference. Getting back to city business, I think your
 original concern was the median strips on the
 interstates, and you say they're cutting sections out
 and you know as an engineer -- I don't know if you
 people knew that Frank was an engineer, the specs are
 set by ODOT. Some we'll argue that sometimes they're
 more astringent that what city projects they want to do
 in their own specifications. But it is the disturbing
 when you see that an happen all the time, even the

1 deterioration of the so-called sound barriers that we
 2 see constantly, all right. So that's an issue again
 3 that is under the state consideration.
 4 Susan **BARBOUR**, I forgot to bring the flowers
 5 but I do have them on my desk when people come in along
 6 with the toilet that you gave me. And I also have a
 7 monarch butterfly in there and I'm going to bring it to
 8 the next meeting so I don't forget that. And you're
 9 intention, Councilman Scott, has it here all the time,
 10 and your intentions are very good and I thank you for
 11 bringing those pictures in. I think as Councilman Scott
 12 said our frustration, it used to be whether it was first
 13 energy or Ohio Bell or when we had **COMPLEXI**
 14 Cable, a simple phone call from anybody we would
 15 get service. Now it's a little bit more where everyone
 16 points their fingers. So that's a little bit of frustration
 17 that we share as far as the dogs is concerned we hope
 18 within the next year to have a plan for a dog park in
 19 our city. I know Councilman Burgio has been bugging me
 20 for a long time about that, notwithstanding walking in
 21 the neighborhoods. There seems to be a great demand in
 22 our city for something like that. We might have a
 23 location becoming available that I think might work well
 24 for us and I have some other issues.

1 With that, the center strip on Snow Road,
 2 this year we hoped to do a renovation there along with
 3 lighting and improve that, and a more suitable monument
 4 for Mr. Garmbeck who lost his life in defense of our
 5 country. I think that that memorial there is a pretty
 6 sad story. But what happened is that ODOT moved forward
 7 with their project doing Snow Road, and we had to move
 8 some money because we needed some emergency repairs to
 9 do, so we hope in next year's budget we'll provide a
 10 more appealable area, similar to what we have around 130
 11 Street and Athens and give a fitting memorial there for
 12 a man who lost, that individual.

13 I love your comments on live stream about
 14 getting a life, and there is a great life here in Brook Park,
 15 and so many things we could do here together.
 16 Unfortunately, we don't live in a perfect world. So
 17 those will have their enjoyment there, God bless them,
 18 and I don't want you to feel afraid about walking your
 19 dog. I thank you for bringing in those pictures. One
 20 of my greatest pet peeves is the grass growing out of
 21 the catch basins. And if I had my way we'd have not
 22 only the street sweeper out every day, we would also
 23 have the street flusher out. We used to have it in the
 24 summertime and people would get up in the morning and
 25 the streets would be clean. Our dilemma is, the other

1 problem the reason you see so much of that,
 2 notwithstanding the street sweeper coming down the
 3 street is, we're not cleaning our catch basins on a
 4 daily basis like we used to. Because the guys would go
 5 in there, they take the lid off, they'd be doing their
 6 cleaning and they would power spray that area to take
 7 those things off of there. So those are some
 8 (inaudible) that we talked about going forward with
 9 council this year and dealing with calcium deposits in
 10 our sewers. And I'm sure we'll have a great discussion
 11 on that. The easiest thing is Ms. McCormick's request
 12 if we have go in the (inaudible) and finding the
 13 letters. I'd like all of you coming in.

14 Liz, where did she go? You said something
 15 -- that's not our issue. Those uniforms we don't have
 16 them in the Brook Park Hilton, so I don't know where you
 17 got that. I would have to talk to the safety director.
 18 And see, I think they're more the color of what Floyd
 19 has on. I'm not certain, but I want to thank you for
 20 coming up here, and I know it's difficult for folks
 21 because sometimes when they come up here -- we have to
 22 accept the blow back of whatever it is. The citizens
 23 shouldn't have to. And notwithstanding I think you're
 24 being a pretty good sport about this whole thing and I
 25 thank you for, that you keep coming; okay?

1 Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
 2 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Councilwoman Powers?
 3 MRS. POWERS: I just want to say one other
 4 thing that with the neighbor helping neighbor that one
 5 of the people who have helped up very much has been Jim
 6 Astorino. He has shared his time, his truck. We
 7 cleaned up a yard and he carried all of the waste
 8 product over to the safety building and dumped it, and
 9 to Ted Hurst -- did he leave? But Ted come over because
 10 we were cleaning up a yard that someone had complained
 11 about and they complained about it as retaliation
 12 because the police had been called against the person
 13 making so much noise. So he got the police report and
 14 reported that.

15 Her yard needed to be cleaned up. Her yard
 16 needed to be cleaned up because she has a handicapped
 17 child that takes up most of her time and she is older
 18 and just didn't have enough time in the day to take care
 19 of her yard and everything else she had to take care of.
 20 So Ted was called to come over during the cleanup
 21 process and the front yard was full of debris, and he
 22 agreed that it would be okay to leave it alone until
 23 we've got both front and back yard cleaned up before we
 24 had to move it. And the call came from the same person.
 25 It was just another retaliation call. So that's some of

1 the things we deal with. But we're out there trudging
 2 away. Thank you, Jim.

3 COUNCIL PRESIDENT: Okay. Thank you. To
 4 move the agenda that concludes the items under letter P.
 5 There's a note that's on the agenda about Executive
 6 Session for Attorney Conferences that was from a prior,
 7 part of the discussion I had with the law director a couple
 8 weeks ago I think it was. So I just put it on
 9 there in case it was needed, but it's my understanding
 10 we do not need that, so I'm just going to remove that
 11 from the agenda for tonight. So we do not need any
 12 motion to go into Executive Session.

 15 MR. MENCINI: Support.


