

**REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BROOK PARK, OHIO
TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, DECEMBER 15, 2020**

The meeting was called to order by Council President Vecchio at 8:02 p.m., the clerk called the roll and the following Members of Council answered:

REPORTS OF SPECIAL COMMITTEES:Southwest General Health Center - Trustee, Orcutt

Mr. Orcutt reported the Southwest Health Center and Southwest board of trustees met on December 9th and approved the 2021 budget including upgrades for the cardiac cauterization system in lab one implementing by June, 2021. The hospital is working in a positive manner for the acquisition of new property that will help with the future growth of Southwest General hospital. Also, the board approved appointments of Dr. Nicolette Scott to the Southwest Health Foundation as a board member of the City of Berea. The 2021 board meeting schedule has been approved with all meetings being held virtually until further notice. As the number of positive tests for COVID-19 increase across the nation Southwest General Hospital is taking all necessary precautions to not spread the virus. Would personally like to thank all the hospital personnel for their hard work and dedication through this pandemic.

Reports of Special committees: cont.**Berea Board of Education Representative, Mencini**

Mr. Mencini reported the Berea City Club will donate \$100,000.00 over the next two years to create a Makers' Space in the new high school. The Maker is designed to give students hands-on experience with equipment, new technologies while fostering individual creativity and critical thinking. The Berea City school district is preparing to bring back students from pre-K to fifth grade sometime in January, 2021. Grades sixth through twelve will remain in hybrid learning to keep the COVID-19 numbers in half and allow for social distancing. According to Superintendent Wheeler schools are not the major source of Covid-19 transmission and when the state goes to the lowest level all students will return five days a week schooling; if there are any issues staff and students will go back to remote learning. Want to give everybody connected to the schools a huge round of applause with what the district dealt with the last nine months is incredible; as well as the parents, grandparents, students, teachers and administration.

Technology and Innovation Council Representative – Poindexter

Mr. Poindexter reported the technology committee has not met since last meeting, however, the committee would like to thank Council for their consideration in passage of the DRIVEOHIO legislation on tonight's agenda; that could be lucrative for the city moving forward. Ms. Markusic wished everyone Happy Holidays and expressed concerns with the public meeting for the central park and the sign-in book used for people to sign in, grant in the amount of \$30,000.00 for a master plan; what was done with the \$30,000.00 grant and what the purpose was and if anything came out of that. What is going to happen to Brook Park School (BPM) located in the same area that is planning on being developed. Glad the city is going after this grant that will be used for equipment; main concern is an explanation of what the \$30,000.00 will be used for and why the city is planning on using \$50,000.00 for equipment. Mr. Troyer stated legislation can be amended at any time, could have been amended at Caucus Prior to meeting. This has to be amended can't just put in another sheet after posting one way, must be amended.

Mr. Cingle stated there are a few amendments and want to make sure done at the proper time so that the ordinance isn't in dispute or issues with it; whenever Council is ready will provide amendments.

Mr. Cingle - Fund 281 - Brook Park Coronavirus Relief Fund - equipment line original amount was to reduce the \$100,000.00 appropriation by \$100,000.00 and is being amended to reduce the current appropriation of \$100,000.00 down to \$35,870.00 for revised amount of \$64,130.00. Reason for the change as stated last week the City of Brook Park is receiving CARES Act funding from Cuyahoga County. Second amendment is in Fund 401 - Capital Improvement Fund - increase the amount under 342 - Parks & Playgrounds original amount from last week was \$46,518.21 and proposed to increase by \$2,000.00 reason for that is there was an increase in the purchase order that was processed for the pressure testing at the water park. That was increased by \$2,300.00 necessitating an increase in this line item and the other change is under Department 411 - Safety Building to reduce that appropriation in equipment down \$2,000.00. The amount will not change it's still \$125,000.00 adjusted amount. For full disclosure in last week's document there was an error in the total adjusted appropriation that has been corrected. The total appropriations will increase by \$64,130.00 due to CARES Act funding received from Cuyahoga County.

Mr. Salvatore commented if there are any changes would like to know about them before the meeting, if at all possible.
