REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR:

Mayor Orcutt reported with the holiday parade the city instead of having the parade leave Brookgate the city is working hard to have everyone lined up at Brook Park memorial school travel down Holland Road to the city's municipal campus and library. The former Super 8 hotel demolition is underway with a completion of 45-days. The library resurfacing project is underway with milling and filling and striping to follow. With the Ford Innovation Center, the city and developers have had discussions to prepare for a second (2nd) building and also easements. Legislation will be introduced tonight relating to the TIF-ACT which allows the city to collect funds for 15 years with those tax dollars being used in and around the Ford Innovation Center. November 8th is election day and encouraged people to get out and vote. Thanked all the veterans for their service and stated that American Legion Post #610 will be having an appreciation dinner on November 11th.

Questions to the Mayor:

Madam Coyne asked Mayor Orcutt for an update as to how many residents applied and received HMAP grants, this year?

Mayor Orcutt responded your concern has been forwarded to the economic development commissioner, who will get those numbers. Several residents have applied but due how the legislation with the seven-years can't qualify. The issue with the HMAP is residents who qualify are not able to get the contractors.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM DEPARTMENTS, COMMISSIONS, AND OTHER PUBLIC OFFICIALS:

Service Director Beyer

Mr. Beyer reported the next bulk week is November 14th on regular rubbish day. The last day for drop-off of rubbish and yard waste is November 18th; the department will be open on Saturdays only from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., for drop-off. In observance of Veterans' Day, the department is closed with Friday rubbish pickup being picked up on Saturday. Leaf pickup is about three weeks in with three to four trucks a day don't park in front of piles and no sticks or dog waste leaf piles will not be picked up. Service crews will be throughout the city setting up for the upcoming holiday events.

Engineer Piatak

Mr. Piatak reported the Delores Blvd. project is wrapped up; the Hio Drive project has the final mainline pave last Friday; contractor is working on driveway aprons on the westerly side with a balance of miscellaneous items that need to be completed. Demolition of the former Super 8 motel the building is down with the contractor is pulling out the recyclables and metals this week and next; slab and pavement removal will follow. The CSX ditch-cleaning project the contractor has received and reviewing all necessary documents from the railroad.

Law Director Horvath

Mrs. Horvath reported with the active civil litigation there is one case of special interest and requested having an executive session at next meeting.

Safety Director Sensel

Mr. Sensel reported the four (4) new police cars were received last Monday and are being up-fitted and decaled. Property maintenance issues are still a high concern keep sending in those work orders.
