Mayor Orcutt stated a few dates, first one being September 7th at 6:00 p.m. the seniors' makeup concert featuring the 24th Polka Pirates. On Friday, September 15th from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. last concert featuring band Moxie with food truck and inflatables. On September 19th the Public Works employees will be at the Caucus meeting informing the additional programs for maintenance of the storm system. On October 12th at 6:00 p.m. the pavilion at the Tri-City Dog Park will be named in Carl Burgio's honor, long time Brook Park resident and Councilmember.

Questions:

Mr. Roberts stated drove by Wedo Park and good to see Ashland Drive blocked off and construction underway for the retention basin. Any update on Blue Abyss on the west end of the city?

Mayor Orcutt responded the environmental testing report has not been generated to date but the testing has been completed. There is much fundraising going on for this project and the French Government will be giving 30% for this project and have been working with state and county officials for the monies. Once the study is generated Blue Abyss will commence construction with a projected date of Spring, 2024 to break ground.

Mr. Troyer clarified with Blue Abyss agreement they purchased the land?

Mayor Orcutt responded still needs to come through and my understanding is within the next week or two.

Mayor Orcutt responded there are three major projects, one being the preliminary with a fourth project coming forward that needs a little more land, there has been no action to date?

Mr. Troyer stated there are rumors about the Cleveland Browns stadium coming.

Mayor Orcutt responded for mixed uses.

Mr. Troyer asked for an update on the (Recreation Center) roof and walls?

Mayor Orcutt responded that is going out to bid the middle of September.

Engineer Piatak

Mr. Piatak reported with the Wedo Park retention basin Ashland and Shelby Drives are closed with site removals wrapping up in the next day or so. Hauling will begin on Wednesday or Thursday, again asking residents to not park on the street. Hauling will take about four weeks to complete weather permitting. With the Brook Park Memorial abatement project work continues with demolition activities to begin in October. The Sheldon Road water main replacement project, between I-71 and Engle Road was given a tentative schedule with work beginning September 18th, westbound traffic will be diverted from Fry Road to Holland Road to Engle Road.

Reports and communications from other departments, commissions and other public officials:

Service Director Beyer

Mr. Beyer reported next week is bulk week on regularly scheduled rubbish day. On September 18th Crossroads Asphalt will be in town for resurfacing of Elmdale and Cynthia between Robert and Fry Road, as well as other minor repairs. Recreation Program Coordinator Morgano

Madam Morgano reported the correct date for Adaptive Fall Baseball is September 20th, registrations are required for this free program. Registrations are taking place for Women's Volleyball and Adult Fall Ball starts this Friday. A few special events coming up is next Friday the concert, as mentioned. Saturday, September 16th is the Safety Fair from 1;00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. The recreation center will be hosting the first Halloween home contest; residents can register online with voting beginning in October.

Questions:

Mr. Troyer stated to Mr. Piatak with the Wedo Park retention basin there are three or four houses on the west side with a storm pipe going on the east side of the tracks to the so-called tower. That will be the first access and then from the Kolleda Ditch.

Mr. Piatak responded there will be a junction chamber on the existing conduit, that's always been the plan, to divert water into the basin from the neighborhoods.

Mr. Troyer clarified water will come from the east side of the tracks and then from Kolleda Ditch.

Mr. Piatak responded no, there will be backwater gauges, flat-water gauges, that will be installed on the outlet side of the basin. To prevent Kolleda ditch from backing up, that has always been the plan, to isolate that neighborhood from Kolleda Ditch.

Mr. Troyer clarified will not be taking anything from Kolleda ditch?

Mr. Piatak responded no.

Mr. Troyer questioned will not going between houses on Harrison?

Mr. Troyer responded there are no planned updates for Shelby and Harrison Drives just to divert water, that was always the plan from the presentation two-years ago.

Mr. Troyer asked when the waterline on Sheldon Road will be done?

Mr. Piatak responded after Thanksgiving going into December, due to the resurfacing pavement project scheduled for next year.
