<u>Aviation & Environmental Committee - Chairman, Dufour</u>

Mr. Dufour reported recently met with Mike Foley, Director of Sustainability for Cuyahoga County and County Councilman, Dale Miller, to be brought up to speed on the Micro-grid's to be built in the Cities of Euclid and Brooklyn. This would be for local electricity systems capable to operate from the main grid for commercial and industrial customers, with any connection happening to residential customers in the short or near term. Micro-grids are small scale local electrical grids that operate independently with a nearly uninterrupted supply of electricity. The electricity that will be initially used for the commercial and industrial customers will come from local solar arrays and other types of renewable and clean energy generation. Power outages and control systems allow these grids to disconnect from the main grid insuring an electrical supply to commercial and industrial

customers. Design and build out will be financed at \$1 million-dollars from the Federal Department of Energy with a lot of engineering and planning to do and are working with (Cleveland Hopkins) airport and local businesses around the airport to hopefully have these electronics flowing in 2027.

Mayor Orcutt reported the title transfer for the 12.8 acres on the west end from the city to Blue Abyss is complete. With former Brookview School Prime One is doing their due diligence and looking to submit plans to the Board of Zoning Appeals and Planning Commission in March; looking to have the final meeting on February 2nd with building commissioner and economic development in attendance. This will be for 89 luxury townhomes with demolition either late spring or early summer of Brookview School. Haven't been able to attend last Council meeting, welcomes two (2) new Councilmembers and this administration is looking forward to working with all of Council to move this city forward.

Law Director Horvath

Madam Horvath reported will have a pending civil cases at the first meeting in February; the status of cases has not changed.

Recreation Program Coordinator Morgano

Madam Morgano reported along with the programs Councilman McCorkle announced the recreation department also has Youth Flag Football at Lou Groza field for grades first (1st) through sixth (6th); registrations due by March 1st. Registrations for the Daddy-Daughter Dance are required and do fill up fast.

Finance Director McGann

Mr. McGann reported last week the city received the Government of Finance Officers Association (GFOA) certificate of achievement for 2022, special acknowledgement to former Finance Director Cingle and Interim Finance Director Maykut. A mailer will be sent to residents with information on income tax filing. The city is now offering e-file this year and on the mailer there will be a QR code that takes residents to the Tax-Connect website. Taxes can be mailed or brought to the tax department for assistance in filing. Households may receive many mailers depending on individuals living in the home over the age of 18. Reminded residents to keep all mailers until all tax returns have been filed; the filing deadline is April 18, 2024.

Safety Director Sensel

No report.

Service Director Beyer

Mr. Beyer reported the 2023 year-end report with the department having 1,007 sewer calls; camera 101 laterals and dug 35 test-tees with seven (7) participating in the lateral replacement program, implemented in mid-2023. Recycled 860-tons; 499-tons of bulk rubbish with 8,418-tons of rubbish collected, recycling numbers are up. Last year there were 28 water breaks with the City of Cleveland being billed \$68,000.00 and reimbursed to the city. The department jetted 69 mainlines that includes both sanitary and storms; cleaned 93 catch-basins; used 215 hot-patch; 44-ton cold-patch and removed 111 trees.

### **Engineer Piatak**

Mr. Piatak reported the former Brook Park Memorial School demolitions project, the foundations and walls have been removed and will be rubberized for transport to another facility; backfill operations will commence later this week or early next week, weather permitting. Have a meeting scheduled next with week with Ohio Rail Commission to go over details for the proposed Eastland pre-signal project, report to follow.

#### **Questions:**

Mr. Mencini stated to Mr. Beyer good report big numbers with sewer calls that are not charged to resident. With the highway or county-owned streets i.e. wall on I-71 graffiti do service crews do anything with that?

Mr. Beyer responded the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) or other entities is notified and are very busy may take some time to get to. If it's an eyesore that needs attention service crews will do themselves and notify ODOT.

Mr. Mencini continued to Mr. Sensel with solicitors they must have a visible permit? Police and Fire great job.

#### Questions to directors: cont.

Mr. Sensel concurred and stated if a resident sees a solicitor call the police department so an officer can check credentials.

Mr. Mencini stated to Engineer Piatak the railroad tracks at Engle and Snow Roads are rough.

Mr. Dufour stated to Mr. Beyer great report and asked to elaborate on water breaks when the road is torn up does the city get reimbursed?

Mr. Beyer responded yes, there is a formula used that enables the city reimbursement per square-footage once the water break is released from the City of Cleveland, for reimbursement of material and time. Usually wait to get a couple water breaks before sending to the City of Cleveland, who is very diligent in looking at the city's reports and numbers.

Mr. Troyer thanked Mr. Sensel and multiple departments involved for the cleanup on Holland Road and car removed from backyard on Southway Drive.

Mr. Troyer thanked Mr. Beyer and crews for the recent issue taken care of very quickly.

Mr. Poindexter asked Mr. McGann the QR code on the mailers is that specific for each individual?

Mr. McGann responded will take resident to city's website.

Mr. Poindexter questioned the information on the mailer?

Mr. McGann responded the mailer will have the resident's tax identification number on the flip side; the QR Code will not be specific.

Mr. Poindexter thanked Mr. Piatak for the recent idea and good insight given, that will be coming forth to Council. Thanked Mr. Beyer for assisting a resident that had water coming into the basement.

To Mr. Modic want to see the upgrades and improvements and state law 717.02 states Council 'shall' analyze proposals and select best bidder. Just want to know what method is being selected, strong proponent for energy efficiency and saving money.
