Mayor Orcutt reported October 28th from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will be having an open house for review of the six (6) buildable improvements of the highway system. City Engineer Piatak

Mr. Piatak reported with the Fry and Sylvia Road projects trees were planted on Fry Road for residents requesting them; Sylvia Drive planting of trees will be taking place soon. Legislation will also be introduced for the Sheldon Road bridge project with changes in the rules and responsibilities between the Northeast Ohio Sewer District (NEORS) and Cuyahoga County; this is time-sensitive and sewer district representatives are in attendance.

Mr. Troyer asked what is the timeframe for this project.

Mr. Blair responded if in by October 31st the county will be going out for Ohio Public Works (OPWC) monies to help pay for the project. Working with the city engineer to finalize designs by first (1st) quarter of 2026; late first (1st) quarter will be going out to bid with construction to start after July 1, 2026, for 210 days. Looking to have construction done in July, 2027 will still be a full road closure to cut construction time in half.

Mr. Troyer asked if affected residents will be notified?

Ms. Velez responded usually a collaboration of both the county and city. The sewer district is required to notify residents of construction. The sewer district has acquired \$2.7 million-dollars of county monies, for this project along with another \$2.7 million-dollars from the sewer district, totaling \$5.4 million-dollars, from the

sewer district. As well as both the Cities of Brook Park and Middleburg Hts. and Cuyahoga County.

Mr. Mencini stated this is big project and well-traveled road. What about the residents that live in the area?

Mr. Blair stated there will be local access for residents to get to and from their homes.

Mr. Poindexter asked before about the width of the bridge. Has been explained before that the width of the bridge is going to be two (2) lanes, as current. With the potential of major development coming to the city is it too late to possibly widen that road.

Mr. Blair responded pretty much locked in based on the specifications and funding from the OPWC. The other issue is widening the road will be a cost and impact the south side.

Mr. Piatak stated want to make Council aware that the legislation adopted by City Council on September 16, 2025 has not changed. It's just some of the mechanics of that agreement with the roles and regulations from the county, have been switched around.
