A RESOLUTION

IN SUPPORT OF HOUSE BILL 361

TO PROVIDE FOR NEW REQUIREMENTS AND INCREASED PENALITIES FOR BLOCKED RAILROAD CROSSINGS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, House Bill 361 proposes to amend Sections 121.95 and 5589.99 and to enact new section 5589.25 of the Revised Code to establish new requirements and increased penalties that apply to a railroad company that unlawfully blocks a railroad crossing; and

whereas, House Bill 361 would require a railroad company to submit to the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio an incident report each time a train blocks a crossing for more than five (5) minutes to the hindrance of traffic, and

WHEREAS, House Bill 361 proposes a Five Thousand Dollar (\$5000.00) fine for a first violation and Ten Thousand Dollar (\$10,000.00) fine for subsequent violations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio that:

- SECTION 1: That the Council of the City of Brook Park, hereby expresses its support of House Bill 361 to amend Ohio law imposing new requirements and increased penalties.
- SECTION 2: The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this Resolution to the introducer of the bill, Representatives Thomas Hall and Jessica E. Miranda.
- SECTION 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
