## A RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING THE PASSAGE OF HOUSE BILL 154
WHICH WOULD REQUIRE A MOTOR VEHICLE WHEN PASSING
A BICYCLE THE SAFE PASSING DISTANCE TO THE LEFT IS THREE FEET,
AND TO ALTER THE PROTOCOL FOR PROCEEDING INTO AN INTERSECTION
THAT HAS MALFUNCTIONING TRAFFIC LIGHTS,
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Ohio House Bill 154 was introduced by Representatives Michael Henne and Michael Sheehy to amend sections of the Ohio Revised Code 4511.132 and 4511.27 to provide that when a motor vehicle passes a bicycle the safe passing distance to the left is three feet, and to alter the protocol for proceeding into an intersection that has malfunctioning traffic lights; and

WHEREAS, the passage of this Bill in the Ohio House and Senate would help improve the safety of bicyclists in Ohio by requiring motorists to pass at a safer distance to the left of three feet and to change the protocol for proceeding into an intersection that has a malfunctioning traffic light; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Brook Park, State of Ohio that:

SECTION 1: This Council does hereby declare its support for passage of House Bill 154 to amend parts of the Ohio Revised Code by requiring motorists to pass at a safer distance to the left of three feet and to change the protocol for proceeding into an intersection that has a malfunctioning traffic light

SECTION 2: The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this Resolution to the introducer of the Bill, Representative Michael Henne, 77 South High Street, 13<sup>th</sup> Floor, Columbus, OH 43215 and to Representative Michael Sheehy, 77 south High Street, 10<sup>th</sup> Floor, Columbus, OH 43215.

SECTION 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

**SECTION 4:** This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for further reason to support the passage of House Bill 154; therefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least (5) members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
