
About the Project

The City of Brook Park would like to invite you to an open house to receive your input on a proposed infrastructure improvement project located in the City of Brook Park, Cuyahoga County. The project includes improvements to the roadway system around the proposed redevelopment of the former Ford Plant site located north of Snow Road and West of I-71. This includes potential improvements to I-71 Northbound, I-71 Southbound, Snow Road, Five Points Road, Engle Road, and a pedestrian bridge over Engle Road. The improvements are intended to increase safety, improve access to the site, and limit traffic congestion on I-71, Snow Road, and Cleveland Hopkins International Airport.

The purpose of the open house is to discuss the project and proposed improvements with the community, answer questions, and gather community input before making decisions. Please stop by at any time during open house hours to view project exhibits, chat with project team members, and submit comments at your leisure. No formal presentation will be given. Upcoming Public Open House for Brook Park Infrastructure Improvements

September 26, 2025 – The City of Brook Park would like to invite you to an open house to receive your input on a proposed infrastructure improvement project located in the City of Brook Park, Cuyahoga County. The project includes improvements to the roadway system around the proposed redevelopment of the former Ford Plant site located north of Snow Road and West of I-71. This includes potential improvements to I-71 Northbound, I-71 Southbound, Snow Road, Engle Road, Five Points Road, and a pedestrian bridge over Engle Road. The infrastructure improvements are intended to increase safety, improve access to the redevelopment site, and limit traffic congestion on I-71, Snow Road, and Cleveland Hopkins International Airport.

Temporary and permanent right-of-way is anticipated to be needed. If right-of-way acquisition from your property is necessary, a real estate representative will contact you directly to discuss the acquisition process and your rights under that process. At this time, maintenance of traffic and detour information is unknown, however short-term road closures are expected to be required to allow for construction. Potential maintenance of traffic and detour information will be shared at the public open house. Access to all properties nearby is expected to be maintained. Utility impacts are expected. Construction is expected to begin in Spring of 2027.

Environmental studies are ongoing. Regulated materials were identified during preliminary reviews and will be addressed during construction. The environmental review, consultation, and other actions required by applicable Federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been, carried out by ODOT pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 327 and the Memorandum of Understanding dated December 14, 2020, and executed by FHWA and ODOT and the Memorandum of Understanding dated December 3, 2024, and executed by FRA and ODOT.

The project is expected to impact the Snow Road Bridge, a resource that is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). The Section 106 process seeks to incorporate historic values into project planning through consultation among agencies and other parties with an interest in the effects of undertaking historic properties. Individuals or organizations with a demonstrated interest in the effects of the project on historic properties can become a Section 106 consulting party. The various consulting parties work together to discuss options, provide multiple viewpoints, and strive to seek common agreement on the incorporating of historic preservation values into the project.
